Island Padel, the home of Padel in Jersey Scott Clayton reports



The Island Padel grade 1 LTA event lived up to all expectations on a sunny September weekend in Jersey. Large numbers of spectators turned out from the local community to watch some of the best



padel players Britain has to offer. The prize pot of £4,000 was one of the largest that has ever been awarded for an LTA padel event.

The men's final was between the top seeds Jorge Martinez Del Campo and Rafael Otaolaurruchi and second seeds Frances Langan and Nikhil Mohindra, it was a well contested match that Martinez and Otaolaurruchi eventally won 6-4 6-3. The Women's final of Lisa Philips and Abigail Tordoff against Helen Crook and Jo Ward also made for fantastic spectating, with Phillips and Tordoff prevailing 6-2 7-5.

Island Padel founder and former Wimbledon doubles player, Scott Clayton is hopeful of the event becoming an annual fixture. He said "The weekend has been really successful, and the turnout has been amazing, it is exactly what we wanted and envisaged by bringing high quality padel to the island, not only for our player base to have some high-quality games but also to give the community of Jersey a feeling of what good padel looks like. We're very thankful to the LTA for giving us the opportunity to host this grade one event and we hope to do it next year on an even bigger scale. Hopefully the players have all enjoyed their time on the island and would be keen to come back for more events in the future."

GB Men's team qualify for the World Championships!



The FIP World Padel Championships European Qualifier landed in Derby's We Are Padel centre on 30th September for 3 days featuring some of the best padel players in Europe. 18 Men's and 13 Women's teams participated with 2 spots up for grabs for the Women and 3 spots for the Men in the Dubai finals in November.

Friday night offered spectators a spectacular match between Sweden and Portugal, the first rubber went to three sets featuring regular World Padel Tour players from both nations.

GB Women's team had good wins over Lithuania and Austria to win their group but were knocked out by a strong Swedish team in the semi-final. GB Men also prevailed against Austria and Hungary in their group, but fell to the Portuguese, arguably the strongest team in the tournament. They met Germany in the play-offs and won 2-1 with Sam Jones and Christian Murphy bringing home the final rubber. The GB Men's team will be booking their tickets to Dubai for November along with Portugal and the Netherlands. Sweden and Portugal Women's teams also qualified. COACHING UPDATE

Existing racket sport coaches, who would like to sign up for LTA Introduction to Padel Coaching CPD can now do so via the LTA website.

The LTA Coach Development & Support team has produced the new Padel Coaching Qualifications, the first 4-day Padel Instructor qualification launched earlier this year; anyone interested can register their interest here. The course costs £400. Coaches working at existing padel venues are prioritised, although the course will soon be delivered externally and will roll out more widely across the UK.

To prepare for the LTA Padel Instructor course you can complete the Readiness Test using the following links. This costs £36 and is carried out remotely/video based.

The LTA Padel coaching team ran an *Introduction to Coaching the Double Glass* in August. Keep an eye out for this course when it next runs in the CPD section of the LTA site.

They have also developed a pilot course for *Coaching Kids Padel: Organisation, Skill Acquisition and Drills,* it ran on 28 September in Scotland, keep a look out for future courses. It is a one-day course and costs £40.
