As a junior player you are expected to abide by the following code of practice:

- All players must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions. Failure to do so will result in action taken if deemed necessary, as appropriate by Tennis Sussex.
- All players must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- Players should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions, or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Players must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach.
- Players must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior players are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing their club or county at competitions.
- Junior players are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
