- 1. Team captains are permitted on court to advise their players during matches.
- 2. Team captains' presence on court is optional and they do not have to be on court for the whole match.
- 3. Team Captains or a nominated deputy, are allowed to stay on court and can only communicate with their player(s) at change of ends within the permitted 60 seconds break (or 90 seconds at set break).
- 4. Team Captains are allowed on court during match tie-breaks or shootouts.
- 5. Team captains must not communicate with the opponent or the opponent's team captain at any time during the match.
- 6. Any problems on court must be raised by the player to the court supervisor. The team captain must not enter into any discussion with the court supervisor unless approached and may not raise issues themselves.
- 7. The Referee reserves the right to remove any team captain from the court if in his/her opinion their presence is detrimental to the match. No discussion will be entered into until after the rubber.
- 8. Team captains may not enter into any discussion with any other team captain whilst on court.
- 9. When there is more than one team captain/adult accompanying the players, only the nominated team captain will be allowed on court during matches. However, this person can nominate a deputy to replace them on court. Only one captain can be on court for a match unless the referee permits otherwise.
