### Lexus Birmingham Open – Tuesday, 3 June, 2025

#### Ann Jones Centre Court - Match 1

**[WC] Johannus Monday (WR244 – GBR) v [Q] Coleman Wong (WR175 – HKG)**  
**Head to Head: First meeting**

##### **JOHANNUS MONDAY highlights:**

- Won 10 ITF singles titles – 2 this year, including one in Sunderland, Great Britain in January, defeating fellow Brit Ryan Peniston in the final. This was played on an indoor hard court.
- Won the 2023 Nottingham doubles title alongside partner Jacob Fearnley, defeating fellow Brits Liam Broady and Jonny O'Mara in the final.
- Currently playing at a career-high ranking of No. 244.
- Never played a main draw match on the ATP Tour.
- Best performance on grass is reaching the semi-finals at the ITF event at Roehampton in 2023.
- Best performance on the ATP Challenger Tour is a semi-final at Knoxville (USA) in 2024. Also reached the quarter-finals at Tenerife and Glasgow this year.
- Played in 7 ATP Challenger Tour events in 2025 with a win-loss record of 7-7.
- No. 1 seed at the ATP Challenger Tour event in Tbilisi, Georgia last month.
- Born in Hull.

##### **COLEMAN WONG highlights:**

- The highest ranked male in Hong Kong's history. Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 128 in September 2024.
- Two-time Grand Slam winner in boys' doubles, at the 2021 US Open and the 2022 Australian Open. Also reached the semi-finals of the boys' singles at the 2022 US Open.
- At 2024 Miami became the first ever Hong Kong player to compete in a main draw match at ATP Masters 1000 level. He fell to Laslo Djere in round one.
- Reached 4 ATP Challenger finals but has lost them all. In his last one he fell to Brit Jacob Fearnley in Lincoln, USA in August last year.
- Won 2 ITF singles titles.
- Lost to Brit Billy Harris in round one at the Nottingham Challenger last year.
- Played just one ATP main draw match on grass, falling to Aleksandar Vukic at Newport last year.
- Yet to win a match on grass at any level (0-4).
- Played in 7 ATP Challenger Tour events in 2025 with a win-loss record of 6-7. Best performance is a quarter-final at Tunis on clay last month.

## Ann Jones Centre Court - Match 2

### [WC] Dan Evans (WR213 – GBR) v [Q] Murphy Cassone (WR207 – USA)

Head to Head: First meeting

#### DAN EVANS highlights:

- Won two ATP Tour titles, at Melbourne-2 in 2021 and at Washington (ATP 500 event) in 2023. Also reached two finals, at Sydney in 2017 and at Delray Beach in 2019.
- Won 9 ATP Challenger Tour Titles, including 3 of grass (Surbiton 2019, Nottingham 2019, 2022). Nottingham 2022 was his last ATP Challenger Tour final.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 21 in August 2023.
- Reached two ATP Masters 1000 semi-finals, at Monte Carlo in 2021 and at Montreal in 2022.
- Best ATP Tour performance on grass is a quarter-final at Eastbourne in 2019 and at Queen's in 2021 - best result at Wimbledon is R3 in 2016, 2019 and 2021.
- Played just one ATP Tour main draw match in 2025, falling to Karen Khachanov as a wild card at Dubai.
- Played in 8 ATP Challenger Tour events in 2025, with his best performance reaching the quarter-finals at Barletta (Italy) on clay, with a win loss record of 6-8.
- Overall ATP Challenger Tour win-loss record on grass is 35-15.
- Born in Birmingham (Hall Green area, South East of Birmingham).

#### MURPHY CASSONE highlights:

- Won his maiden ATP Challenger Tour title at Calgary, Canada in October last year.
- Played College tennis at Arizona State.
- Yet to play an ATP Tour main draw match.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 204 in April.
- Played in 11 ATP Challenger Tour events in 2025 with a win-loss record of 16-11. His best results are reaching three semi-finals, at Nonthaburi-2, Nonthaburi-3 (both in Thailand) and at Lugano (Switzerland).

## Ann Jones Centre Court - Match 3

### Jana Fett (WR143 – CRO) v [WC] Jodie Burrage (WR165 – GBR)

Head to Head: First meeting

#### JANA FETT highlights:

- Reached the girls' singles final at the 2014 Australian Open, falling to Elizaveta Kulichkova.
- Best results on the WTA Tour are reaching two semi-finals, at 2017 Hobart and 2017 Tokyo.
- This year qualified for the Australian Open but lost to Brit Harriet Dart in round one. Also qualified at Stuttgart and Madrid, reaching the round of 16 in Germany where she fell to Iga Swiatek.
- 4th appearance at Birmingham – failed to qualify in 3 of those appearances and played just one main draw match here, falling to Zhang Shuai in 2022.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 97 in October 2017.
- Reached one final at WTA 125 level, falling to Anna Kalinskaya at Midland, USA in 2023.
- Played in three WTA 125 events this year with a win-loss record of 2-3.
- Has lost to the likes of Katie Boulter and Heather Watson and on the grass at Surbiton.

#### JODIE BURRAGE highlights:

- Reached her maiden WTA Tour final at Nottingham in 2023, falling to compatriot Katie Boulter, first all-British WTA singles final since 1977.
- Won the biggest title of her career at W100 Dubai last December.
- Also reached the final at ITF Ilkley in 2022 and the quarter-finals at the WTA 500 event in Linz last year.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 85 in September 2023.
- Her best result at the Grand Slams is reaching R2, at Wimbledon 2023, at the 2023 US Open and at this year's Australian Open.
- Won the WTA Tour doubles title at Cluj Napoca in 2023 alongside partner Jil Teichmann.
- Defeated WR-4 Paula Badosa at Eastbourne in 2022 – best win by a British woman other than Konta since 2013.
- Partnered Katie Boulter in Great Britain's decisive doubles win over the Netherlands in the Billie Jean King Cup qualifiers in April.
- Reached the quarter-finals of the ITF event at Birmingham on a hard court in 2022, but lost her only previous main draw match at Birmingham on grass, to Harriet Dart in 2023.
- Injury plagued 2024 season, missing almost seven months, from February to September 2024, with a wrist injury that required surgery, followed by an ankle injury.
- Played in one WTA 125 this year, falling to Tatjana Maria in round two at Puerto Vallarta.

### Maddison Inglis (WR156 – AUS) v [2] Kimberly Birrell (WR66 – AUS)

**Head to Head: Birrell leads 4-1**

**Last meeting:** Feb 2025 W75 (ITF) Brisbane Hard Final Birrell 62 46 76(2)

Also met in the final of an ITF event at Playford, Australia in 2022, with Birrell winning 36 75 64

#### **MADDISON INGLIS highlights:**

- Won 9 ITF singles titles, most recently at Playford, Australia, in October last year.
- Best Grand Slam performance is reaching round 3 at the 2022 Australian Open, where as a wild card she defeated Leylah Fernandez and Hailey Baptiste before falling to Kaia Kanepi.
- Qualified for her first WTA 1000 main draw at Indian Wells this year, falling to Sofia Kenin in round one.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 112 in March 2020.
- Played in one WTA 125 event this year, falling to Rebeka Masarova in the quarter-finals at Puerto Vallarta.

#### **KIMBERLY BIRRELL highlights:**

- Reached her maiden WTA Tour final at Osaka in October last year, falling to Suzan Lamens.
- Won 5 ITF singles titles, most recently at Brisbane in February where she defeated Inglis in the final.
- Reached the mixed doubles final at this year's Australian Open alongside compatriot John-Patrick Smith - they lost to fellow Aussies Olivia Gadecki and John Peers.
- Currently the Australian No. 3 behind Daria Kasatkina and Maya Joint. Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 60 in May.
- Played in two WTA 125 events this year with a win-loss record of 1-2. Defeated Bianca Andreescu at Vic, Spain in April.
