### [ALT] Marc-Andrea Huesler (WR158 – SUI) v Otto Virtanen (WR114 – FIN)

#### Head to Head: Huesler leads 3-0

Last meeting: 2024 s'Hertogenbosch Grass Q2 Huesler 76(3) 76(4)

#### MARC-ANDREA HUESLER highlights:

- Bids to reach a 28th ATP Challenger Tour quarter-final, and a 4th in 2025.
- Won one ATP Tour title, at 2022 Sofia, defeating Holger Rune in the final.
- Won 7 ATP Challenger Tour titles, including one this year, at Cuernavaca, Mexico in April.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 47 in February 2023.
- Reached one quarter-final on grass, at the 2022 Nottingham Challenger.
- Played in six ATP Challenger Tour events in 2025 with a win-loss record of 12-4.
- Defeated Harold Mayot <u>76(1) 64</u> in round one.

#### **OTTO VIRTANEN highlights:**

- Bids to reach a 17th ATP Challenger Tour quarter-final, and a 1st of 2025.
- Never reached a quarter-final on the ATP Tour.
- Won 6 ATP Challenger Tour titles, most recently at Brest in October last year.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 91 in November 2024.
- Won the 2018 Wimbledon boys' doubles title with partner Yanki Erel.
- Best result on grass is reaching the quarter-finals at 2022 Surbiton, where he fell to Brit Ryan Peniston.
- Played in six ATP Challenger Tour events in 2025 and won his 1st match of the year at this level in round one this week, defeating No. 4 seed Aleksandar Vukic <u>76(4) 63</u>.

#### Martin Landaluce (WR145 – ESP) v [PR] Lloyd Harris (WR227 – RSA) Head to Head:

#### MARTIN LANDALUCE highlights:

- Bids to reach a 13th ATP Challenger Tour quarter-final, and a 2nd this year (Prague).
- Won the boys' singles at the 2022 US Open, defeating Gilles-Arnaud Bailly in the final.
- Won 1 ATP Challenger Tour title, at Olbia, Italy, last October, becoming the youngest Spaniard to win a Challenger title since Carlos Alcaraz in 2021.
- Won 1 match in the main draw on the ATP Tour, against Jaume Munar at ATP 1000 Miami last year.
- Made his Grand Slam main draw debut this year at the Australian Open, falling to James McCabe.
- Handed wild cards at the Australian Open and at ATP 1000 Miami this year, but lost in round one on both occasions.
- Defeated No. 1 seed Mattia Bellucci <u>46 64 76(5)</u> in round one.

#### LLOYD HARRIS highlights:

- Bids to reach a 32nd ATP Challenger Tour quarter-final, and his 3rd on grass, after Surbiton and Ilkley last year.
- Reached two ATP Tour singles finals fell to Andrey Rublev at 2020 Adelaide and to Aslan Karatsev at 2021 Dubai, where he became the first qualifier to reach the final in the tournament's 30-year history.
- Won the title at Surbiton last year, defeating Brit and namesake Billy in the semi-finals. He also reached the last 8 at Ilkley last year.
- Best Grand Slam result was reaching the quarter-finals at the 2021 US Open, where he fell to Alexander Zverev. He's the last South African player, man or woman, to reach the last 8 at a Grand Slam.
- Best ATP Tour performance on grass was reaching the semi-finals at 2023 Mallorca, where he fell to Christopher Eubanks.
- Won 6 ATP Challenger Tour titles, most recently at Surbiton last year.
- Defeated Rafal Nadal at 2021 Washington.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 31 in September 2021.
- Missed 7 months from July 2024 to February 2025 with a back injury that required surgery. He also had surgery on his wrist in 2022.
- His last ATP Tour main draw match came at Wimbledon last year. He is playing here on a protected ranking of No. 227.
- Played in 4 ATP Tour Challenger events in 2025 with a win-loss record of 2-3.
- Defeated Jay Clarke <u>64 36 64</u> in round one.

#### [LL] Sijia Wei (WR130 – CHN) v [2] Kimberly Birrell (WR66 – AUS) Head to Head: Birrell leads 1-0

2023 Nanchang Hard R32 Birrell 75 75 The match above was Wei's debut in the WTA Tour main draw.

#### SIJIA WEI highlights:

- Bids to reach just a second quarter-final at this level reached one WTA 125 final, in Canberra, Australia at start of this year, falling to Aoi Ito.
- Won 10 ITF singles titles.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 114 in March.
- Best performance on the WTA Tour is reaching the round of 16 on two occasions (both in China).
- Made her Grand Slam main draw debut at the Australian Open this year, falling to Jasmine Paolini.
- Lost to Lizette Cabrera in the final round of qualifying earlier this week.
- Defeated Sayaka Ishii <u>64 64</u> in round one.
- Owns a 2-9 win-loss record against top 100 players wins have come against No. 51 Rebecca Sramkova at 2024 Guangzhou and No. 93 Elena Gabriela Ruse at 2024 Beijing.
- Played in five WTA 125 events this year with a win-loss record of 5-5.
- Bids to become the 4th lucky loser to reach a WTA 125 quarter-final in 2025.

#### KIMBERLY BIRRELL highlights:

- Bids to reach a 1st ever quarter-final at this level. Did reach the last 8 at the WTA Tour events in Brisbane and Singapore this year.
- Reached her maiden WTA Tour final at Osaka in October last year, falling to Suzan Lamens.
- Won 5 ITF singles titles, most recently at Brisbane in February where she defeated Inglis in the final.
- Reached the mixed doubles final at this year's Australian Open alongside compatriot John-Patrick Smith - they lost to fellow Aussies Olivia Gadecki and John Peers.
- Currently the Australian No. 3 behind Daria Kasatkina and Maya Joint. Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 60 in May.
- Played in three WTA 125 events this year with a win-loss record of 2-2. Defeated Bianca Andreescu at Vic, Spain in April.
- Reached the semi-finals at Ilkley last year, falling to Rebecca Marino.
- Born in Dusseldorf, Germany.
- Defeated Maddison Inglis 6-1 6-4 in round one.

2021 PragueHardSFMartincova 63 64Martincova ended up losing to Barbora Krejcikova in the final.

#### **GREET MINNEN highlights:**

- Bids to reach a 5th quarter-final at this level, and her 1st since Charleston in March 2024.
- Never reached a singles final on the WTA Tour, but has won two doubles titles.
- Best singles performance on the WTA Tour is four semi-finals, most recently at Austin in February, where she fell to McCartney Kessler.
- Best performance at the Grand Slams is reaching round three at the 2021 and 2023 US Opens (2021 as a lucky loser, 2023 as a qualifier).
- Reached two WTA 125 finals, both in 2023, at Kozerki, Poland and St Malo, France.
- This is just her second WTA 125 event this year fell in round one at St Malo in April.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 59 in October 2023.
- Best performances on grass are reaching the quarter-finals at the WTA Tour event in s'Hertogenbosh in 2019 and last year. Also reached last 8 at the ITF events at 2021 Nottingham and 2024 Surbiton in 2024.
- Defeated Arianne Hartono <u>64 62</u> in round one.

#### TEREZA MARTINCOVA highlights:

- Bids to reach a 1<sup>st</sup> quarter-final at this level, and indeed at any level for 2 years.
- Reached one final on the WTA Tour, falling to Barbora Krejcikova at 2021 Prague she defeated Minnen in the semi-finals.
- Reached the last four at 2022 Nottingham when it was a WTA Tour event she lost to eventual champion Beatriz Haddad Maia.
- Reached the quarter-finals at 2021 Birmingham when it was a WTA Tour event, falling to Daria Kasatkina.
- Achieved a career-high ranking of No. 40 February 2022.
- Not played a main draw match on the WTA Tour this year. She had a break from tennis for 7 months from August 2024 to March this year.
- Defeated Rebecca Marino <u>36 64 61</u> in round one.
- Bids to become the 11th qualifier to reach a WTA 125 quarter-final in 2025.
- Owns 54 wins against top 100 players.
