Andy Murray Arena - Match 1

Petra Kvitova (WR574 – CZE) v Beatriz Haddad Maia (WR22 – BRA)

Head to Head: Tied 1-1

2022 Birmingham Grass R32 Haddad Maia 76(4) 62 2022 Eastbourne Grass SF Kvitova 76(5) 64

Each time they've previously met, the winner has gone on to win title.

PETRA KVITOVA highlights

- Two-time Wimbledon champion (2011, 2014). Also reached final at 2019 Australian Open.
- Won 31 titles on WTA Tour, most recently on grass at 2023 Berlin.
- Won 6 WTA Tour titles on grass 2 at Wimbledon, 2 at Birmingham (2017, 2018), 1 at Eastbourne (2022) and 1 at Berlin (2023).
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 2 in October 2011.
- Owns 60-23 win-loss record against fellow left-handed players.
- Won one match this year since return to Tour after maternity leave, defeating Irina Camelia Begu at Rome, with
 - 1-5 win-loss record. Fell to Viktoriya Golubic in R1 at Roland Garros.

BEATRIZ HADDAD MAIA highlights

- Won 4 titles on WTA Tour, including two on British grass in 2022, at Birmingham and Nottingham.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 10 in June 2023, becoming 1st Brazilian woman in history to crack top 10.
- Semi-finalist at 2023 Roland Garros, falling to Iga Swiatek. Was 1st Brazilian woman to reach last 4 at a Grand Slam since Maria Bueno at 1968 US Open.
- Reached round of 16 at 2023 Wimbledon, becoming 1st Brazilian woman to reach that stage at SW19 since Bueno in 1976.
- Owns 43-25 win-loss record against fellow left-handed players, with 4-1 record on grass (only defeat, against Kvitova, 2022 Eastbourne).
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 6-16. Fell to Hailey Baptiste in R1 at Roland Garros.
- Lost 1 match to player ranked outside top 200 in 2025, falling to WR-215 Linda Fruhvirtova at Miami.

Andy Murray Arena - Match 2

Daria Kasatkina (WR16 – AUS) v [WC] Sonay Kartal (WR50 – GBR)

Head to Head: First meeting.

DARIA KASATKINA highlights

- Won 8 WTA Tour singles titles, most recently at WTA 500 Ningbo, China last October.
- 6 of her 8 titles have come at WTA 500 level, including on grass at Eastbourne last year, defeating Leylah Fernandez in final.
- Since 2021 no one has reached more finals at this level than her (11).
- 3-time finalist on British grass also runner-up at 2021 Birmingham and 2023 Eastbourne.
- Quarter-finalist at 2018 Wimbledon, falling to Angelique Kerber.
- Switched nationalities in April.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 8 in October 2022.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 14-13. Fell to Mirra Andreeva in R4 at recent Roland Garros
- Owns 32-16 win-loss record against lefthanders, with 2-2 record on grass. Won last such match, against Fernandez in Eastbourne final last year.
- Owns 3-0 win-loss record against British players on grass.

SONAY KARTAL highlights

- Won maiden WTA Tour title at Monastir in 2024, becoming 5th different British woman to win Tour-level title since 2012, after Konta, Watson, Raducanu and Boulter - previously there was a 24 year drought between 1988 and 2012
- Also recorded best Grand Slam result last year, reaching R3 at Wimbledon as qualifier.
- Member of Great Britain team that has qualified for Billie Jean King Cup Finals in Shenzhen,
 China in September, defeating Germany's Jule Niemeier and the Netherlands' Eva Vedder in the qualifiers in April in what was her debut in that event.
- Reached R16 at Indian Wells this year as lucky loser, falling to WR-1 Aryna Sabalenka. Became
 just 10th lucky loser to reach the R16 at a WTA 1000 event and scored best rankings win over
 her career over WR-17 Haddad Maia en route.
- Owns 1-4 record against top 20 players only win against WR-17 Haddad Maia.
- Currently at career-high ranking of No. 50.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 9-8. Fell to Marie Bouzkova in R2 at Roland Garros.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record on grass is 2-6, with both of her wins coming at Wimbledon last year.
- Owns 1-5 record in her opening WTA Tour main draw matches on grass, with only victory coming against Sorana Cirstea at Wimbledon last year.

Andy Murray Arena - Match 3

[WC] Jodie Burrage (WR162 – GBR) v [8] Amanda Anisimova (WR15 – USA)

Head to Head: First meeting.

JODIE BURRAGE highlights

- Reached maiden WTA Tour final at Nottingham in 2023, falling to compatriot Katie Boulter, first all-British WTA singles final since 1977.
- Won biggest title of her career at W100 Dubai last December.
- Also reached final at ITF likley in 2022 and quarter-finals at WTA 500 event in Linz last year.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 85 in September 2023.
- Best result at Grand Slams is reaching R2, at Wimbledon 2023, at 2023 US Open and at this year's Australian Open.
- Won WTA Tour doubles title at 2023 Cluj Napoca alongside partner Jil Teichmann.
- Defeated WR-4 Paula Badosa at 2022 Eastbourne best win by British woman other than Konta since 2013.
- Partnered Katie Boulter in Great Britain's decisive doubles win over the Netherlands in Billie Jean King Cup qualifiers in April.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 4-6.
- Owns 1-5 win-loss record against top 20 players only victory against WR-4 Badosa at 2022 Eastbourne.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record on grass is 9-9. Four of those wins came in run to final of 2023 Nottingham.
- Injury plagued 2024 season, missing almost seven months, from February to September 2024, with wrist injury that required surgery, followed by ankle injury.

AMANDA ANISIMOVA highlights

- Won 3 WTA Tour titles, most recently at WTA 1000 Doha in February, defeating Jelena Ostapenko in final.
- Best performance on grass is reaching four quarter-finals, most recently at 2022 Wimbledon, where she fell to Simona Halep.
- Won girls' singles title at 2017 US Open, defeating Coco Gauff in final.
- Currently playing at career-high ranking of No. 15.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 17-9. Fell to Aryna Sabalenka in R4 at Roland Garros.
- Last defeat against player ranked as low as Burrage was against WR-292 Marta Kostyuk at 2019 Madrid.

[6] Karolina Muchova (WR14 - CZE) v [Q] Maddison Inglis (WR152 – AUS)

Head to Head: First meeting.

KAROLINA MUCHOVA highlights

- 2023 Roland Garros finalist, falling to Iga Swiatek. Also two-time semi-finalist at US Open (2023, 2024) and at 2021 Australian Open.
- Won 1 WTA Tour title, at Seoul in 2019. Owns 1-5 win-loss record in WTA Tour finals.
- Best performance on grass is three quarter-finals, at 2019 and 2021 Wimbledon, and at Eastbourne last year.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 8 in September 2023.
- Suffered from various injuries over past few years.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 12-8. Fell to Alycia Parks in R1 at Roland Garros
- Last defeat to player ranked as low as Inglis was against WR-174 Rebecca Sramkova at 2023 Warsaw.

MADDISON INGLIS highlights:

- Qualified for main draw by defeating Kamilla Rakhimova and Priscilla Hon.
- Played at Birmingham last week, falling to compatriot Kimberly Birrell in R1.
- Won 9 ITF singles titles, most recently at Playford, Australia, in October last year.
- Best Grand Slam performance is reaching R3 at 2022 Australian Open, where as wild card defeated Leylah Fernandez and Hailey Baptiste before falling to Kaia Kanepi.
- Qualified for first WTA 1000 main draw at Indian Wells this year, falling to Sofia Kenin in R1.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 112 in March 2020.
- Owns a 0-3 win-loss record against top 20 players. Highest ranked player she's defeated is WR-24 Leylah Fernandez at 2022 Australian Open.
