EMMA NAVARRO

- Bids to reach 19th WTA Tour quarter-final, and 6th of 2025.
- Bids to reach 4th WTA Tour quarter-final on grass.
- Bids to reach 9th WTA 500 quarter-final, and 5th in 2025. No one reached more quarter-finals at this level than her in 2025 (4).
- Owns 21-14 win-loss record against left-handers.
- Won 2 WTA Tour titles, at 2024 Hobart and at Merida (WTA 500 event) in February.
- Wimbledon quarter-finalist last year, falling to Jasmine Paolini. Also reached semi-finals at US Open last year, falling to Aryna Sabalenka. Fell to Jessica Bouzas Maneiro in R1 at Roland Garros this year.
- Owns 21-14 win-loss record against lefthanders.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 8 in September 2024, when 1st cracked top 10.

BEATRIZ HADDAD MAIA

- Bids to reach 30th WTA Tour quarter-final, and 2nd of 2025.
- Bids to reach 4th WTA Tour quarter-final on grass, and 1st in 3 years.
- Bids to reach 13th WTA 500 quarter-final, and 2nd in 2025 (Strasbourg).
- Owns 12-13 win-loss record against top 10 players, winning 3 of last 4.
- 1st match against top 10 player on grass since fell to Rybakina at 2023 Wimbledon.
- Won 4 WTA Tour titles, including two on British grass in 2022, at Birmingham and Nottingham.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 10 in June 2023, becoming 1st Brazilian woman in history to crack top 10.
- Semi-finalist at 2023 Roland Garros, falling to Iga Swiatek - 1st Brazilian woman to reach last 4 at Grand Slam since Maria Bueno at 1968 US Open.
- Reached round of 16 at 2023 Wimbledon, becoming 1st Brazilian woman to reach that stage at SW19 since Bueno in 1976.

Andy Murray Arena - Match 2

[WC] Sonay Kartal (WR50 – GBR) v [8] Amanda Anisimova (WR15 – USA)

Head to Head: First meeting.

SONAY KARTAL

- Recorded best win by ranking when defeated WR-16 Daria Kasatkina in round one. Bids to go one better here today.
- Bids to reach just 2nd WTA Tour quarter-final, after Monastir last year.
- Bids to become 9th British woman to reach WTA 500 quarter-final, after Baltacha, Boulter, Burrage, Dart, Keothavong, Konta, Raducanu and Watson.
- Bids to become 1st British woman to reach quarter-finals at Queen's since Winnie Shaw in 1972.
- Won maiden WTA Tour title at Monastir in 2024, becoming 5th different British woman to win Tour-level title since 2012, after Konta, Watson, Raducanu and Boulter - previously there was a 24 year drought between 1988 and 2012
- Recorded best Grand Slam result last year, reaching R3 at Wimbledon as qualifier, becoming 1st British qualifier to reach R3 at SW19 since Karen Cross in 1997.
- Member of Great Britain team that has qualified for Billie Jean King Cup Finals in Shenzhen, China in September, defeating Germany's Jule Niemeier and the Netherlands' Eva Vedder in the qualifiers in April in what was her debut in that event.
- Reached R16 at Indian Wells this year as lucky loser, falling to WR-1 Aryna Sabalenka. Became just 10th lucky loser to reach R16 at WTA 1000 event.
- Currently at career-high ranking of No. 50. This marks 1st time since February 1986 that three British women are in top 50 (Croft, Durie, Hobbs). This time last year was ranked at No. 271.

AMANDA ANISIMOVA highlights

- Bids for British double, having defeated Jodie Burrage in round one.
- Bids to reach 22nd WTA Tour quarter-final, and 4th of 2025. Reached just 2 in 2024.
- Bids to reach 5th WTA Tour quarter-final on grass, and 1st since 2022 Wimbledon.
- Won 3 WTA Tour titles, most recently at WTA 1000 Doha in February, defeating Jelena Ostapenko in final.
- Best performance on grass is reaching four quarter-finals, most recently at 2022 Wimbledon, where she fell to Simona Halep.
- Won girls' singles title at 2017 US Open, defeating Coco Gauff in final.
- Currently playing at career-high ranking of No. 15.

Andy Murray Arena - Match 3

[Q] Anastasia Zakharova (WR111) v [2] Madison Keys (WR8 – USA)

Head to Head: First meeting.

ANASTASIA ZAKHAROVA

- Defeated last year's Wimbledon semi-finalist Donna Vekic in round one – it was her 1st ever WTA Tour main draw match on grass.
- Bids to reach 2nd WTA Tour quarter-final – at Hong Kong last year she fell to Katie Boulter in last eight.
- 1st ever match against a top 10 player. Before today highest ranked player she had faced was No. 21 Vekic on Monday.
- Reached round three at 2024 Australian Open, defeating Putintseva in round one.
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 106 in November 2024. Set to crack top 100 for 1st time (currently at No. 90 in live rankings).

MADISON KEYS highlights

- Reigning Australian Open champion – maiden Grand Slam title. It was her 46th major appearance – only Flavia Pennetta (49 major appearances to win 2015 US Open) and Marion Bartoli (47 major appearances to win 2013 Wimbledon) have taken longer to claim 1st Grand Slam title.
- Bids to reach 55th WTA Tour quarter-final, 12 years after her first.
- Bids to reach 6th WTA Tour quarter-final of 2025, which would equal her highest number of quarter-finals in a season since 2016.
- Won 10 WTA Tour titles, including 3 on grass (2014, 2023 Eastbourne and 2016 Birmingham).
- Best performance at Wimbledon is two quarter-finals (2015, 2023).
- Achieved career-high ranking of No. 5 in February, when cracked top 10 for 1st time since August 2019.
- Last defeat to player ranked as low as Zakharova was to No. 140 Alexandra Eala at Miami this year.
- Last defeat to player ranked as low as Zakharova on grass was to No. 120 Evgeniya Rodina at 2018 Wimbledon, when ranked No. 11.
