The HSBC Championships is one of the most popular and longest-running grass court tennis events. Established in 1889, the tournament is held at the Queen's Club in West Kensington each June. In 2025 it welcomes back a women's event for the first time since 1973.

Six British women are in the draw - Katie Boulter, Emma Raducanu, Sonay Kartal, Jodie Burrage, Francesca Jones and Heather Watson.

Three of the world's top 10 are here – reigning Australian Open champion Madison Keys, Qinwen Zheng and Emma Navarro. In addition three Wimbledon champions, Petra Kvitova, Elena Rybakina and Barbora Krejcikova are in the draw.

Other notable names are Grand Slam finalists Karolina Muchova and Leylah Fernandez, who are joined by Beatriz Haddad Maia, whose first two WTA titles came back-to-back on grass in the UK in 2022.
