[5] Diana Shnaider (#12) vs. Katie Boulter (GBR #34)

Shnaider leads 1-0

Rybakina leads 1-0

Shnaider:

- Owns one title at a WTA-500 event: Bad Homburg 2024. This is her lone Tour-level title on grass
- Holds a 1-0 career record against Boulter, winning their lone meeting at Hong Kong (hard court) in 2024
- Has 25 wins in career over Top 50 players. Is 7-3 in such matches on grass
- Is currently ranked No.12; this time last year was ranked No.48; could climb as high as No.11 this week
- With a win would reach a grass-court quarterfinal for the third time in her career having won the title at Bad Homburg 2024 and reached quarterfinal at Birmingham 2024

Boulter:

- Owns one title at a WTA-500 event: San Diego 2024
- Best career results on grass were a pair of Champion runs at Nottingham in 2024 and 2023
- Has six wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.13 Jelena Ostapenko at Eastbourne 2024.
- Winner of today will face [2] Madison Keys

[Q] Heather Watson (GBR #164) vs. [4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #11)

Watson:

- Owns one title at a WTA-500 event: Monterrey 2016
- Won first Tour-level match of 2025 in the 1r against Yulia Putintseva
- Seeking first win against a Top 20 opponent on grass since Wimbledon 2017 (def. No.19 Anastasija Sevastova, 2r)
- Best career result on grass is Semi-Finalist at Nottingham 2023, Birmingham 2021 and Eastbourne 2017 and 2014
- Five times in her career, Watson has reached the quarterfinals as a qualifier
- Winner of today will face Tatjana Maria

Rybakina:

- Owns four titles at a WTA-500 event: Strasbourg 2025, Abu Dhabi 2024, Brisbane 2024 and Stuttgart 2024
- Holds a 1-0 record against Watson, winning their lone meeting at Hobart (hard court) in 2020
- Is 5-0 in matches against players from United Kingdom, including 2-0 on grass
- Best career result on grass was a Champion run at Wimbledon in 2022 (d. No.2 Ons Jabeur in F)
- Has advanced to the QF-or-better in four of her last five tournaments on grass

[WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #37) vs. Rebecca Sramkova (SVK #41)

Raducanu:

- Looking to reach second quarterfinal of the year after doing so in Miami
- Reached two quarterfinals on grass last year at Eastbourne and Nottingham; best career result on grass was semifinal run at 2024 Nottingham
- Has gone 7-2 against Top 50 opponents on grass
- Looking to equal best career result at a WTA 500 by reaching the final eight; has done so five previous times most recently at Seoul 2024

Sramkova:

- This is just her second Tour-level event on grass after falling in the first round at Wimbledon last year
- Beat 2024 Wimbledon champion, No.17 Barbora Krejcikova in first round here for fifth career Top 20 win and first main draw career win on grass
- Looking to reach second quarterfinal of the year also doing so at Merida (I. Arango)
- Also looking to win back-to-back matches for the first time since that quarterfinal run at Merida in February

[1] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #5) vs. McCartney Kessler (USA #42)

Zheng:


- Competing as the No. 1 seed this week for third time in career; has gone on to win the title each previous time at 2024 Tokyo and 2024 Palermo
- Looking to reach sixth quarterfinal of the year
- Would also be first ever career quarterfinal on grass
- Has gone 15-5 against players outside the Top 20 this year

Kessler:

- Playing just second grass court main draw of career after falling first round at Wimbledon last year as a qualifier
- Beat Francesca Jones in first round for first career main draw win on grass and first Tour-level win since Miami
- Looking to reach third quarterfinal of the year and first ever at a WTA 500 event
- Holds 1-4 record against Top 10 players with sole win over No.3 Coco Gauff at Dubai earlier this year

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won first four titles of career in 2024 across all three surfaces; WTA 500 Bad Homburg and WTA 250s Hua Hin, Budapest and Hong Kong. Reached her first Grand Slam 3r at 2024 Wimbledon and advanced to R16 at 2024 US Open
- Cracked into the Top 20 on August 12, 2024, where she stayed for the rest of the year finishing the season at World No.13
- Also in 2024, won the Paris Olympic silver medal in women s doubles with Mirra Andreeva
- Reached 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2023 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Sakkari in 3s) and Roland Garros 2023 (l. Haddad Maia)
- Won WTA 125K Series title in Montevideo, Uruguay last November to end 2022 just outside Top 100
- Overall win-loss record in 2022 was 56-17; reached four ITF Circuit finals, highlighted by a 15-match, three tournament winning streak, culminating with a W60 title in Istanbul
- Last season only Tour-level outing was qualifying exit at St. Petersburg
- Won first ITF Circuit tournament at W15 event in Antalya in late 2021
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Moscow
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Played first senior matches on ITF Circuit towards end of 2020
- As junior, made SF at Roland Garros in 2021 and US Open in 2022. Also won girls' doubles at three of the four majors and reached No.2 in the ITF rankings

- 2024 season saw Boulter rise to a career high ranking of No.23, achieved on Nov 4, 2024. Successfully defended title at Nottingham (d. Ka. Pliskova in F) and won San Diego (d. Kostyuk in F). Made SF at Tokyo (l. Kenin) and wrapped up the year with a final run at Hong Kong (l. champion Shnaider).
- In 2023 captured first WTA singles title of career on home soil at Nottingham; made Top 50 debut at No.50 the week of September 11; advanced to 3r at Wimbledon for second year in a row (l. Rybakina), and at US Open for first time (l. Stearns).
- Also in 2023, reached 2r as qualifier at both Montreal and Beijing; on ITF Circuit won one singles title at Canberra and reached two finals in Japan; went 2-0 in singles in November
 S Billie Jean King Cup play-offs against Sweden
- During the 2022 grass court season, advanced to QF at Nottingham (ret. vs. Davis w/right elbow injury) and 2r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Opened 2021 season by reaching 3r at the Gippsland Trophy in Melbourne (l. Osaka); upset No.14 seed Gauff in 2r
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$15k ITF/Sharm El-Sheikh-EGY. Earlier in the year, made 2r at Acapulco (l. Zhu) and fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Svitolina) in only Tour-level outings
- Suffered a stress fracture in her back which forced her out for much of 2019. Best results prior to injury were 2r showing at Australian Open and SF run at \$25K ITF/Solapur-IND (l. Raina)
- Won the WTA's first-ever 10-point match tiebreak at a Slam to see off Makarova in 1r at 2019 Australian Open
- Reached career-high No.82 on February 18, 2019
 Broke into the Top 100 the week of October 15,
- Broke into the top 100 the week of October 15, 2018
- Made significant strides in 2018, reaching first WTA QF of career at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Barty) - defeated Stosur en route for her first win over a Grand Slam winner. Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)
- Part of Great Britain Fed Cup Team, 2018-19
 Fell 1r on tour level main draw singles debut at 2017 Wimbledon (as WC, l. McHale)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of six singles titles and four doubles titles


- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Britain in 2011
- Appeared in girls' singles at all four Slams, reaching 3r at Australian Open, Wimbledon and US Open, and was R-Up in doubles at 2014 Australian Open (w/Jorovic, l. Kalinina/Kulichkova). Other junior highlights include winning Lemon Bowl in Rome at age of 11, and reaching final at Junior Orange Bowl in Florida at age 14

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 made 2r on three occasions at Tour level; Abu Dhabi, Nottingham and Seoul. On the ITF circuit lifted W50 Nottingham title and made finals at W50 Roehampton and W100 Shrewsbury
- In doubles in 2024 reached the final at WTA 500s Brisbane w/Minnen and Abu Dhabi w/Noskova and quarterfinals at Paris Olympics w/Boulter
- 2023 season highlighted by SF run at Nottingham [] qualified but lost to eventual champion Boulter in SF. Also had QF runs at Hua Hin (l. Wang Xinyu) and Warsaw (l. Wickmayer).
- Best results of the 2022 season were runs to R16 at Wimbledon (l. Niemeier) and 3r at Miami (l. Bencic)
- At 2021 Birmingham became only the third British woman to make SF at the tournament (l. eventual champion Jabeur)
- Broke back into Top 50 at No.49 (March 2, 2020)
 her highest ranking since June 15, 2015 (No.47)
 after a campaign in which she lifted her fourth career title and first since 2016 at Acapulco (d. Fernandez in F)
- Highlight of 2019 was R-Up finish at Tianjin (l. Peterson)
