FAST4 OPEN REGIONAL TOUR COMPETITIONS

HOW CAN I APPLY TO RUN A GRADE 1 OR GRADE 2 PADEL COMPETITION?

Please contact the LTA Customer Support Team (using the enquiry form) to let us know that you are interested in delivering a Grade 1 or Grade 2 Padel competition. We will then send you the relevant information including details on how to apply.

WE'D LIKE TO RUN PADEL COMPETITIONS BUT HOW CAN WE FIND A REFEREE?

In this scenario please submit the application(s) for your Padel competition(s), and then once the application period has closed we will contact all those that have submitted applications to confirm how they can request support with finding officials for their event(s) (e.g. you will need to complete a short online form providing the details of your competition(s) and we will then circulate this to qualified Padel referees and ask them to contact you directly if they are able to officiate at the event).

HOW CAN I LET YOU KNOW IF I HAVE A PREFERENCE TO RUN CERTAIN AGE GROUP EVENTS IN THE ONE DAY PROGRAMME SO YOU CAN CONSIDER THIS WHEN ALLOCATING EVENTS?

WHAT VENUE CAN I USE TO RUN MY COMPETITIONS?

Only LTA Registered Venues are able to run Grade 1 to 6 competitions. This ensures all tournament venues meet Safeguarding Minimum Standards and have adequate insurance cover in place to protect organisers, officials, players and spectators. Prior to submitting any availability or application you must ensure that the venue you are planning to use is LTA Registered.

CAN I RUN MORE THAN ONE EVENT/AGE GROUP ON THE SAME DAY?

Where court space allows, venues/organiser are encouraged to run multiple events on one day across different age groups and grades.

It is important to prioritise the competition experience for the players and so please be sure to plan your competitions carefully, to avoid excessive wait times between matches.



WHY ARE THE 9U AND 10U COUNTY TOUR (GRADE 4) COMPETITIONS GENDER SPECIFIC, WHEREAS LOCAL TOUR (GRADE 5) COMPETITIONS CAN BE MIXED?

Grade 4 events will be single gender in the 10U and 9U age groups to better prepare children playing higher graded events for the next stage of the pathway. Any organisers wishing to run mixed gender competitions should apply for Local Tour (Grade 5) competitions.

WHAT IS THE 10&U COURT TRIAL?

As part of our ongoing efforts to enhance the tennis experience for young players, we will be trialling a modified green court at all 10U County Tour (Grade 4) and Local Tour (Grade 5) events taking place in the January – April 2026 period.

Please read the <u>10&U Modified Court Trial brief</u> if you are planning to run 10&U events in this window as they will have to be played on the modified court.

At Grade 3 weeklong (holiday) competitions the following scoring formats must be used:

- 9U: Best of three tiebreaks to 7 (winning by 2 clear points)
- 10U: Two FAST4 sets with a deciding match tie-break
- 11U Open: All main draw matches to be two full sets with a deciding match tiebreak. FAST4 scoring to be used for consolation and Doubles matches only.

WHAT TIME SHOULD MY EVENTS START AND FINISH?

When scheduling your competition please consider the planned finish time of your event. We'd like to stress that events for younger juniors should not be scheduled to finish late into the evening on either Saturday or Sunday. We appreciate that available court time is often limited but we would ask that organisers adhere to the following when planning their competitions:

ANY ADDITIONAL CAN RUN AND WHY ARE NOT AVAILABLE?



We continue to offer more event dates on which Grade 5 competitions can be delivered, with options including weekdays during school holidays. The only dates Grade 5s will not be available as an option will be when directly clashing with Youth League Winter fixtures, to encourage juniors to prioritise team competition.

Any organiser that wishes to submit a request for Grade 5 events that don't fall in line with the County and Local tour requirements, should contact competitionplanning@lta.org.uk during the application period and request any additional events/formats formally in writing for the LTA Competitions Team to consider. The Competitions Team will review and approve at their discretion. Please keep in mind that the aim is to ensure consistency where possible, but due to differing player bases it is important to have a flexible approach to ensure players are supported.

WHAT CAN I DO IF I MISS THE AVAILABILITY DEADLINE (ONE DAY COMPETITIONS) OR APPLICATION DEADLINE (WEEKLONG COMPETITIONS)?

<u>Late applications will not be considered</u>. However, if in advance of the deadline, you foresee any difficulties in applying on time, please contact <u>competitionplanning@lta.org.uk</u> at the earliest opportunity and we will be able to provide further support.

HOW DOES THE LTA ALLOCATE COMPETITIONS FROM THE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AND WHY WAS I NOT ALLOCATED EVERYTHING FOR WHICH I MADE MYSELF/MY VENUE AVAILABLE (ONE DAY) OR FOR WHICH I APPLIED (WEEKLONG)?

Whilst we will endeavour to allocate you as many one day competitions as we can, venues/organisers will be selected according to their availability, the location of events within the region, previous tournament delivery experience, and the required provision in the county/region.

When reviewing weeklong applications, we conduct an open application process. Please remember that venues who have previously hosted a grade 3 tournament are not guaranteed a successful grade 3 application in subsequent years, although the history of the tournament will be considered.

We need to ensure sufficient access to competition according to the player base within a region and the concentration of both competition venues and organisers varies from area to area.
