DISABILITY TENNIS – LEADERBOARD POINTS EXPLAINED

HOW TO EARN LEADERBOARD POINTS

Across all impairments there must be a minimum of 3 entries in an event for a player to receive leaderboard points. Different grades of tournaments have different point allocations; the same point tables are used for each leaderboard. Only points earned in regional and national disability tournaments in the relevant impairment count for leaderboards.

Only one set of points is allocated per event i.e., a player who competes in both the qualifying and main draw events of a tournament will only get one set of points. A player must win a match in a draw to receive any points. A player who does not win a match in a draw will receive one point for participation. A player who partners with a volunteer will receive no points.

A walkover and a bye do not count as a win, but a retirement does. A player who is disqualified will not receive any leaderboard points.

HOW ARE LEADERBOARD SCORES CALCULATED?

Across all impairments, a leaderboard score is calculated from the total of the player's best 3 singles results and 25% of the best 3 doubles results within the previous 52 weeks.

HOW IS THE LEADERBOARD ORDER DETERMINED?

Across all impairments, the leaderboard order is determined by:

- (a) the player's leaderboard score over a rolling 12-month period;
- (b) if unresolved, the total number of events used to obtain the results
- (c) if unresolved, the highest singles Ranking points received from individual events
- (d) if unresolved, the second highest singles Ranking points received from individual events

LTA LEARNING DISABILITY POINTS SYSTEM

Points are awarded to players in Yellow ball, Green ball and Orange ball. Different grades of tournaments have different point allocations; the same point tables are used for each ball colour.

The leaderboard data will be used to award prizes at the end of each year as follows:

- 1. "Leaderboard Winner" This will be awarded for each leaderboard (Yellow, Orange and Green) A player MUST have competed in a minimum of two Learning Disability events to receive this prize.
- 2. "Most Tournaments Entered" this prize will be given to the player who has attended the most competitions. This prize is open to all ball colour events.

LTA VISUALLY IMPAIRED POINTS SYSTEM

LTA Visually impaired leaderboard points will be issued to all players competing at each regional VI tournament and the National Finals at the end of the year. If a player 'plays up' and enters a higher sight category than they are classified in, they will receive points for the category they have played in e.g., if a B2 player enters the B3 event they will receive B3 event points.

If sight categories combine due to low numbers of players, players will receive points based on the sight category they enter, e.g. A B2 entering as a B2 will get B2 points and a B3 entering as a B3 and playing in the same merged draw will get B3 points. This does mean that a player can have entries under two separate tables, if they 'play up' for some tournaments and not for others; this is unfortunate, but points are not transferrable from one category to another. At present B4 and B5 categories are always combined at tournaments so this will be one category for now (B4/5 Female, B4/5 Male). If due to low numbers of men and women, these will combine into a category with points still awarded for the round reached. Players will receive leaderboard points based on their most successful result in the tournament.

Players can only compete in one sight category during a tournament. The only exception is when the B1 event is held on a separate day to the B2 – B5 event and then any B1 players that wish to play up into the B2 category can do so.

LTA WHEELCHAIR POINTS SYSTEM

Each Tournament Organiser and Referee will set the draw sizes dependant on the number of players entered and their skill level. Tournaments with enough entries to run a main draw and a second draw are encouraged to do so to ensure players all have competition that is appropriate to them. Where there is a main draw and a second draw, the points for the second draw are listed across (this may be used for Nationals). Where there is one draw only the 'Main draw' points will be used. Leaderboard Points will not be awarded for any consolation matches; however, Tournament Organisers are encouraged to run consolation if time permits.

Players from the Novice category are permitted to play in main draw doubles. Doubles points are awarded to each player.
