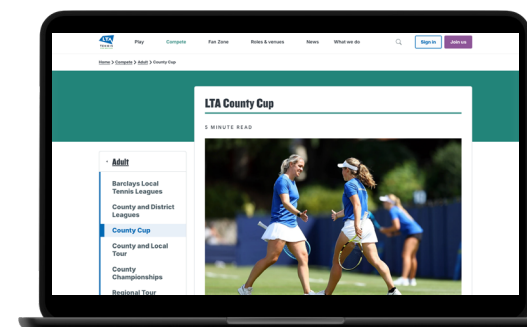
In Group 1 this year we welcome Northumberland and Nottinghamshire Women's teams, and Middlesex and Cambridgeshire Men's teams.

LTA SUMMER COUNTY CUP EXPLAINED

LTA County Cup events give players the opportunity to represent their county in a competitive team environment, with age groups ranging from 8U through to the open age groups.

The LTA Summer County Cup is possibly the oldest tennis event on the domestic calendar, with Gloucestershire men being the winners back in 1895 and Surrey winning the first women's event in 1899.

The 44 competing counties are organised in six groups of six counties per group and two groups of eight counties on a league basis in both the mens' and ladies' events.

Group 1 is the premier group with the men's and ladies' teams playing at Devonshire Park, Eastbourne with the top counties in this group winning the County Championships. The other men's and ladies' groups play at 12 grass court venues throughout the country, with the leading two counties being promoted to the group above them. The bottom two teams are relegated to the group below except, of course, those in Group 7.

Each county team consists of three doubles pairs. Over the course of the week, each county will play every other county in its group. Each match consists of every pair in one team meeting every pair in the other team, over the best of two tie-break sets and a match tie-break (to 10 points), thus making nine rubbers in each match. The team scoring the most rubbers wins by a score which can vary from 5-4 to 9-0.

At the end of the week, the county winning the most matches is the winner. Should, as is often the case, two or more counties be level on matches, the winner of the group, or **County Champion**, is decided in favour of:

- a) The team with the greatest number of match points
- b) If match points are equal, the team with the greatest number of rubber points
- c) If only two teams are level on match points and rubber points; their head to head result
- d) If more than two teams are level, the percentage of sets won out of sets played (if after this calculation, only two teams remain level, their head to head result will be used to break the tie)
- e) If more than two teams are level, the percentage of games won out of games played (if after this calculation, only two teams remain level, their head to head result will be used to break the tie)



Therefore, every county not only wants to win every possible match, but every possible rubber, set and game.

Over the course of the week a team (county) will play a maximum of 45 rubbers (ie) 9 rubbers per day and, as demonstrated later in the programme, assuming a player is nominated to play in each rubber on every day it is possible for them to win 15 rubbers out of 15 rubbers which is a unique feat and one that is recognised.

Players umpire their own matches and there are no ball kids.

All rubbers shall be the best of two tie-break sets and a match tie-break (to 10 points).

Counties nominate a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 10 players.

Team nominations listed in this booklet are provisional nominations and may not reflect the Final Team Nominations which are submitted to the Referee 30 minutes before the commencement of play on the first day.

Daily nominations must be submitted 15 minutes before the start of each day's play, and cannot be changed. In the event of a pair having to concede a rubber, because of injury, or for some other reason, the score is recorded as a 6-0, 6-0 win by the other side.

LTA 'COUNTY CUP RACE' EXPLAINED

WHAT IS THE 'COUNTY CUP RACE'

The County Cup Race recognises a County's performance in all County Cup Events. Points will be allocated after each event, starting with the 18U Event in March and will conclude with the Winter County Cup Event in November. The County with the most points across all Events will be recognised as the overall County Cup Race Champion for that year. In addition, recognition will also be made to the county making the biggest year on year improvement on their previous year's final position.

- Points are awarded per County Cup Event (male and female events)
- For the Summer, Winter, Over 35s and 18U County Cup Events counties will receive 'initial' base points according to the group they are in and then additional ('group') points according to their final group position
- The points for the 14U, 12U, 11U, 10U & 9U County Cup Events are cumulative based on their success at the group stage and the finals stage (if applicable)
- Points are not allocated for the 8U County Cup Event
- If a county is late in submitting their team nominations, subject to the Event Manager's discretion, they may be deducted 2 points per team per Event
- If a county's player(s) achieve 15 rubbers out of 15 at the Summer County Cup Event that county will receive 2 bonus points per player

THE 15/15 CLUB EXPLAINED

The LTA Summer County Cup is a traditional, annual inter-county team event consisting exclusively of doubles. It is played on grass, usually during the third week of July.

As most followers of 'County Week' know, this is top quality, hard fought tennis with the pride of playing for one's county at stake; for many this is the pinnacle of their tennis careers.

Over the course of the week a county team plays a maximum of 45 rubbers, (ie) 9 rubbers per day.

Assuming a player competes in every rubber, it is possible for him/her to win 15 out of 15 rubbers - an exceptional achievement! A more detailed Roll of Honour can be found on the Adult County Cup area of the [County Cup website](https://www.lta.org.uk/county-cup).

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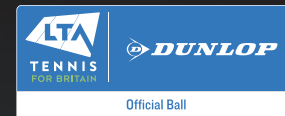
