[WC] Jack Pinnington Jones (GBR) vs Camilo Ugo Carabelli (ARG) First Meeting

Jack Pinnington Jones | Age: 23 | World No. 145 | Career-High No. 132 | 2026: 2-3 (Dallas QF) | Event: 0-1 ('25 1R)
 > Achieved career-high No. 132 in May 2026 soon after defeating No. 20 Cobolli for biggest win of career en route to his 1st ATP Tour QF in Dallas as No. 181-ranked qualifier.
 > Made his ATP Tour debut at 2025 Eastbourne as WC, losing to Borges in 1R and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2025 Wimbledon, defeating Etcheverry in 1R.
 > Boasts 37-26 Challenger record (2-2 in finals), defeating countryman and former World No. 14 Edmund to win 1st title at 2025 Nottingham-3 and did not drop a set en route to 2nd title at 2025 Winston-Salem.
 > Wimbledon boys' singles quarter-finalist in 2021 peaked at No. 6 in the junior rankings, before playing college tennis for Texas Christian University, former team of his countrymen Norrie and Fearnley.

NOTE: Pinnington Jones seeks third Top 100 win of the season after defeating No. 20 Cobolli and No. 68 Spizzirri to reach Dallas QF in February. 23-year-old also aims to record second tour-level win on grass after defeating No. 53 Etcheverry in Wimbledon 1R last year (l. to Cobolli in 2R).

Camilo Ugo Carabelli | Age: 27 | World No. 57 | Career-High No. 43 | 2026: 12-14 (Marrakech SF) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 200 in January 2022, Top 100 in August 2022 and Top 50 in July 2025 after reaching back-to-back ATP Tour SFs in Bastad and Umag, achieving career-high No. 43 in August 2025.
 > Entered Rio de Janeiro as LL after squandering 4 MPs in qualifying and advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF, defeating Faria in second quarter-final between lucky losers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990.
 > Did not drop a set to qualify for 2022 Roland Garros, then won 5th-set TB vs. Karatsev in tour-level debut.
 > Posted 49-16 Challenger record in 2024, leading all players for most Challenger wins that year, highlighted by titles in Piracicaba, Santa Cruz and Villa Maria.
 > Peaked at No. 70 on ITF Junior Circuit, winning 2 boys' singles and 4 boys' doubles titles.

NOTE: Ugo Carabelli aims to record his first ATP Tour win on grass courts after going 0-3 on the surface last year (0-7 in sets). 27-year-old is 7-1 in opening rounds since the start of March, lone loss to Shevchenko in Rome 1R.

Brandon Nakashima | Age: 24 | World No. 31 | Career-High No. 29 | 2026: 18-13 (Brisbane F) | Event: 1-2 (2022 2R)
 > Former World No. 3 junior broke into Top 50 in July 2022 and achieved career-high No. 29 in May 2025 soon after earning his 100th win en route to biggest SF of his career in Acapulco.
 > Defeated countryman Giron to win 1st ATP Tour title in hometown of San Diego in 2022 and ended season on 16-1 run in tiebreaks.
 > Played in back-to-back ATP Tour finals at Los Cabos and Atlanta as 19-year-old in 2021, becoming youngest American to reach multiple finals since Roddick in 2001-02.
 > Returned to Milan and went 5-0 to capture 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals title after reaching SF in 2021.
 > Reached Roland Garros 3R, Wimbledon 4R and US Open 3R in 2022, highlighted by Top 20 wins over No. 16 Shapovalov in Wimbledon 2R and No. 19 Dimitrov in US Open 2R and defeated No. 15 Rune and No. 18 Musetti to reach 2024 US Open 4R.

NOTE: Nakashima began his grass-court season by advancing to Queen's Club semi-finals last week, including win over No. 6 de Minaur in QF for his third Top 10 win (now 3-20). He aims to extend his unbeaten record vs. left-handers this season (3-0) and is making his third appearance in Eastbourne, defeating Clarke in 2022 1R for sole win.

Jack Draper | Age: 24 | World No. 160 | Career-High No. 4 | 2026: 5-4 (Indian Wells QF) | Event: 3-1 (2022 SF)
 > During 2022 season, broke into Top 200 in February, Top 100 in June and Top 50 in September and achieved career-high No. 4 in June 2025, joining Nadal as only left-handers to break inside Top 5 of PIF ATP Rankings this century.

- > Became ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2025 Indian Wells, defeating Rune in 1st ATP Masters 1000 or Grand Slam final between players born in 2000s and reached 1st ATP Tour final on clay at 2025 Madrid.
- > Advanced to 2024 US Open SF without losing a set, becoming 4th British man in semi-finals of that event in Open Era, following Rusedski (1997), Henman (2004) and Murray (2008, 2011-12).
- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title by defeating 2-time champion Berrettini in 2024 Stuttgart final and earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Alcaraz at Queen's Club 2R in back-to-back weeks.
- > Ended junior career by achieving career-high No. 7 and reaching 2018 Wimbledon boys' singles final (d. Mejia 7-6 6-7 19-17 in SF).

NOTE: Draper is playing in his first event since retiring in Barcelona 1R in April, being sidelined with knee issue since, and aims to earn his first win since defeating No. 3 Djokovic in Indian Wells 4R in March. He advanced to 2022 SF in only prior appearance in Eastbourne and is playing in 1st match while coached by former World No. 1 Murray.

Jan Choinski | Age: 30 | World No. 106 | Career-High No. 101 | 2026: 0-3 (3 times in 1R) | Eastbourne: 0-1 (2023 1R)

- > After being ranked outside of Top 500 in September 2022, he broke into Top 200 in April 2023 and achieved career-high No. 101 in May 2026 after rallying from a set down 4 times in 5 matches to win his 8th Challenger title in Zagreb.
- > Earned 1st tour-level win of career over No. 56 Lajovic at 2023 Wimbledon as a WC (l. to Hurkacz in 2R).
- > Represented Germany until 2018 and made ATP Tour debut as 19-year-old WC at 2016 Stuttgart (l. to Stakhovsky in 1R) and played his 2nd ATP Tour main draw seven years later at 2023 London / Queen's Club as WC.
- > Owns 153-131 Challenger record (8-1 in finals), capturing titles at 2022 Campinas, 2023 Meerbusch, 2024 Tulln, 2025 Troyes, 2025 Bunschoten, 2025 Bad Waltersdorf, 2025 Valencia and 2026 Zagreb.
- > Reached career-high No. 17 in juniors, advancing to SF of 2014 US Open boys' singles, defeating future-World No. 6 Berrettini in 3R.

NOTE: Choinski earned Top 100 wins over Wu and Giron in qualifying to enter fourth ATP Tour event this season after Montpellier, Doha (as Q) and Bucharest. He seeks his third tour-level win of career after defeating No. 56 Lajovic at 2023 Wimbledon and No. 288 Fonseca at 2024 Estoril (0-7 since).

Alexei Popyrin | Age: 26 | World No. 100 | Career-High No. 19 | 2026: 8-15 (2 QFs) | Eastbourne: 1-1 (2021 2R)

- > Achieved career-high No. 19 in August 2025 after reaching ATP Masters 1000 Toronto QF in his title defense.
- > Posted 5 consecutive Top 20 wins, including saving 3 MPs vs. Dimitrov in 3R en route to 2024 Montreal title, becoming 1st Australian ATP Masters 1000 champion since Hewitt in 2003.
- > Earned biggest win of career over 4-time champion No. 2 Djokovic to reach 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2024 US Open after entering tournament with 0-6 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.
- > Reached 1st ATP Tour SF, advanced to 1st final and won 1st title at 2021 Singapore and beat former champion Wawrinka for 2nd title at 2023 Umag.
- > Qualified 10 times at tour-level events in 2019, tying single-season record set by M. Zverev in 2016.
- > Peaked at No. 2 in junior rankings after ending career with 17 straight wins and 2017 Roland Garros boys' singles title.

NOTE: Popyrin owns 1-9 tour-level record vs. Brits in his career, sole win over Fearnley in Geneva 2R last year, and 0-4 on grass, including loss to Murray in Briton's last singles tournament of career at 2024 Queen's Club. He began his grass court season in Halle last week, losing to qualifier Collignon in 1R.

Zizou Bergs | Age: 27 | World No. 48 | Career-High No. 38 | 2026: 9-14 (Monte-Carlo 3R) | Eastbourne: 0-1 ('25 1R)

- > Former World No. 12 junior broke into Top 200 in July 2021, Top 100 in June 2024 and achieved career-high No. 38 in May 2026 soon after run to Aix-en-Provence Challenger final.
- > Advanced to 2024 Roland Garros 3R as Q and 2025 US Open 3R and earned Top 10 wins over No. 9 Rublev at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Miami and No. 5 Auger-Aliassime to help Belgium to 2026 United Cup SF.
- > Earned personal-best 31 wins in 2025, reached ATP Tour finals in Auckland and 's-Hertogenbosch and saved 2 MPs vs. Diallo in 4R to reach his 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF in Shanghai.

> Received 2022 Wimbledon WC after defeating former World No. 8 Sock for 2022 Ilkley Challenger title as Q.
 > Also won Challenger titles at 2021 St. Petersburg-1 as Q, 2021 Lille as Q, 2021 Almaty, 2023 & 2024 Tallahassee, 2023 Drummondville and 2023 Yokkaichi.

NOTE: Bergs seeks first tour-level win since defeating No. 260 Topo in Munich 1R (0-6 since) and first win on grass since advancing to 's-Hertogenbosch final last year (0-6 since). He bids to become the third Belgian man to record 10 wins this season, joining Blockx (12) and Collignon (11).

Jaume Munar | Age: 29 | World No. 44 | Career-High No. 33 | 2026: 8-11 (3 QFs) | Eastbourne: 0-0 (Debut)

> Former World No. 3 junior advanced to 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals SF and reached No. 52 in 2019, before breaking into Top 50 in July 2025 and achieving career-high No. 33 in December 2025.

> Defeated countryman Alcaraz before falling to countryman Carreno Busta in 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Marbella.

> Recorded personal-best 31 wins in 2025, advanced to Wimbledon 3R (d. No. 31 Bublik in 1R) and 2025 US Open 4R after 0-11 start to career in Grand Slam 2Rs.

> Earned 2 Top-5 wins over No. 3 Zverev at 2019 Marrakech 2R and No. 3 Ruud at 2022 Tokyo 1R.

> Owns 142-73 Challenger record (10-8 in finals), including most recent clay-court title at 2024 Bad Waltersdorf.

> Reached 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles final and won boys' doubles title in 2015 with countryman Lopez San Martin.

NOTE: Munar looks to record third Top 50 win on grass courts (2-8) after defeating No. 35 Thompson in Queen's Club 1R and No. 31 Bublik in Wimbledon 1R, both last year. He would be the third Spaniard to earn a men's singles main draw win in Eastbourne this decade after Davidovich Fokina (2021 2R, 2025 SF) and Martinez (2022 2R).
