### LEXUS ATP HEAD2HEAD: SINGLES SEMI-FINALS

#### Zizou Bergs (BEL) vs [LL] Toby Samuel (GBR)

#### First Meeting

**Zizou Bergs** | Age: 27 | World No. 48 | Career-High No. 38 | 2026: 12-14 (Eastbourne SF) | Eastbourne: 3-1 ('26 SF)  
> Former World No. 12 junior broke into Top 200 in July 2021, Top 100 in June 2024 and achieved career-high No. 38 in May 2026 soon after run to Aix-en-Provence Challenger final.

> Advanced to 2024 Roland Garros 3R as Q and 2025 US Open 3R and earned Top 10 wins over No. 9 Rublev at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Miami and No. 5 Auger-Aliassime to help Belgium to 2026 United Cup SF.

> Earned personal-best 31 wins in 2025, reached ATP Tour finals in Auckland and 's-Hertogenbosch and saved 2 MPs vs. Diallo in 4R to reach his 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF in Shanghai.

> Received 2022 Wimbledon WC after defeating former World No. 8 Sock for 2022 Ilkley Challenger title as Q.

> Also won Challenger titles at 2021 St. Petersburg-1 as Q, 2021 Lille as Q, 2021 Almaty, 2023 & 2024 Tallahassee, 2023 Drummondville and 2023 Yokkaichi.

**NOTE:** Bergs entered Eastbourne on a 6-match tour-level losing streak before advancing to the semi-finals without dropping a set. He now aims to reach his third ATP Tour final (0-2), after Auckland and 's-Hertogenbosch last year, to become first Belgian men's finalist in tournament history and jump to No. 39 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#).

**Toby Samuel** | Age: 23 | World No. 142 (Career-High) | 2026: 2-2 (Eastbourne SF) | Eastbourne: 2-0 (2026 SF)

> Ranked outside Top 1000 in June 2025, broke into Top 200 in March 2026 after going on a 15-match winning streak and achieved career-high No. 142 in June 2026.

> Qualified for tour-level debut at 2026 Roland Garros, ousting No. 7 seed Damm in Q1 and rallied from a set down to defeat former-World No. 7 Goffin in Q2 and Bueno in Q3.

> Won 3 titles in as many weeks from February to March 2026, winning M25 Vale do Lobo before Challenger titles at Hersonissos-1 and Hersonissos-2, going 30-1 in sets during that period.

> Owns 38-18 Challenger record (4-0 in finals), winning first two titles in back-to-back weeks at 2025 Soma Bay and 2025 Manama-2.

> Peaked at No. 56 in junior rankings in 2020, highlighted by advancing to 2019 Wimbledon boys' doubles semi-final with countryman Fery before playing college tennis for University of South Carolina.

**NOTE:** Samuel entered the draw as a lucky loser after No. 3 seed F. Cerundolo withdrew (hip) and earned first tour-level wins of career over Tirante and J. Cerundolo to reach his 1st ATP Tour QF and SF. Now, 23-year-old is No. 123 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) and would rise to No. 109 if he becomes 2nd lucky loser to reach men's Eastbourne final. He seeks second Top 50 win of career after defeating No. 45 J. Cerundolo in QF. If both Samuel and Draper win on Friday, it would mark the first all-British men's tour-level final in the Open Era.

**Humbert Leads 1-0**

**Jack Draper** | Age: 24 | World No. 160 | Career-High No. 4 | 2026: 8-4 (Eastbourne SF) | Event: 6-1 (2022, 2026 SF)  
 > During 2022 season, broke into Top 200 in February, Top 100 in June and Top 50 in September, achieving career-high No. 4 in June 2025, joining Nadal as only left-handers to break Top 5 of PIF ATP Rankings this century.  
 > Became ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2025 Indian Wells, defeating Rune in 1st ATP Masters 1000 or Grand Slam final between players born in 2000s and reached 1st ATP Tour final on clay at 2025 Madrid.  
 > Advanced to 2024 US Open SF without losing a set, becoming 4th British man in semi-finals of that event in Open Era, following Rusedski (1997), Henman (2004) and Murray (2008, 2011-12).  
 > Captured 1st ATP Tour title by defeating 2-time champion Berrettini in 2024 Stuttgart final and earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Alcaraz at Queen's Club 2R in back-to-back weeks.  
 > Ended junior career by achieving career-high No. 7 and reaching 2018 Wimbledon boys' singles final (d. Mejia 7-6 6-7 19-17 in SF).

**NOTE:** Draper looks for 8th ATP Tour final (3-4), first since ATP Masters 1000 Madrid last year, and first on home soil. He is No. 131 on PIF ATP Live Rankings and could reach No. 119 if he becomes second\* British men's finalist at this event after Rusedski in 1997 and 2003, then held in Nottingham. He seeks third Top 30 win of the season after defeating No. 20 F. Cerundolo and No. 3 Djokovic en route to ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells QF in March.

**Ugo Humbert** | Age: 28 | World No. 30 | Career-High No. 13 | 2026: 23-16 (Adelaide Final) | Event: 5-2 (2025-26 SF)  
 > Broke into Top 20 in November 2023 and achieved career-high No. 13 in April 2024 soon after winning Dubai, joining Gulbis and Klizan as third player in Open Era to win 6th ATP Tour title in 6th final (now 7-4 in finals).  
 > Went on a 13-match winning streak on French indoor hard courts, capturing titles at 2023 Metz and 2024 Marseille and equaling biggest win of career over No. 2 Alcaraz en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2024 Paris.  
 > Upset No. 6 A. Zverev and No. 7 Rublev en route to 3rd of 7 career titles at 2021 Halle.  
 > Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Auckland as 21-year-old to become youngest French champion since Gasquet, 21, at 2007 Mumbai and saved 4 MPs vs. Evans en route to 2nd ATP Tour title at 2020 Antwerp.  
 > Earned 14 wins vs. Top 10, including biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev at 2022 ATP Cup.  
 > Defeated former No. 3 Thiem 6-3 6-0 to win 7th Challenger title of career at 2022 Rennes and in May 2023 earned 8th and 9th Challenger titles in Cagliari and Bordeaux in a 3-week span.

**NOTE:** On his 28th birthday, Humbert aims to reach his 12th ATP Tour final (7-4), second this season (Adelaide, l. to Machac) and second on grass after winning 2021 Halle. He is 16-1 vs. players ranked outside Top 100 since September 2024, lone loss to No. 149 Brooksby in Eastbourne SF last year, avenging the loss by defeating Brooksby in 2R this week. He would be first French men's finalist in Eastbourne since Monfils in 2017 (l. to Djokovic).

#### Nys/Roger-Vasselin Notes

- > Monegasque/French duo is 50-36 as a pair (13-14 in 2026), making their team debut at 2022 's-Hertogenbosch before starting a regular partnership at the start of 2025 season.
- > Finished 2025 season as No. 9 on [Year-End PIF ATP Doubles Teams Rankings](#).
- > Captured 1st title as a team in Tokyo and advanced to finals of Marrakech, Washington and Brussels, all in 2025.
- > Defeated Jebens/Vocel in 1R, received walkover by Ram/Salisbury in QF and recorded straight sets win over Johnson/Zielinski in SF to reach their 1st ATP Tour final this season.
- > Roger-Vasselin is playing in his first Eastbourne final after losing in semi-finals in 2018 w/Lindstedt and 2019 w/Martin and bids to be first French men's doubles champion in tournament history.
- > Nys bids to become the first Monegasque champion in tournament history in his fifth appearance at the event.
- > Team is ranked No. 14 on [PIF ATP Doubles Teams Rankings](#). Nys is ranked No. 20 (career-high No. 12 in 2023) and Roger-Vasselin is ranked No. 19 (career-high No. 6 in 2014).
- > Nys, 35, is 8-10 in tour-level finals, plays in his first ATP Tour final on grass, and would become the first man representing Monaco to win a tour-level doubles title on grass courts in the Open Era.
- > Roger-Vasselin, 42, is 29-21 in tour-level doubles finals, bidding to become second Frenchman to win 30 doubles titles in Open Era, joining Mahut (37) and seeks second ATP Tour title on grass after 2013 Newport w/Mahut.
- > Roger-Vasselin is 1-3 in grass court finals, including finals at Wimbledon in 2016 w/Benneteau and 2019 w/Mahut.

#### Andreozzi/Guinard Notes

- > Argentine/French duo is 33-17 as a team (22-10 in 2026), making their team debut at US Open in August last year.
- > Won 1 ATP Tour title as a team at 2026 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells and advanced to finals of 2025 Metz and 2026 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.
- > Defeated Ho/Oberleitner in 1R, Bhambri/Venus in 2R and saved 1 MP to beat No. 2 seeds Harrison/Skupski in SF.
- > Andreozzi would be the first Argentine men's doubles champion in tournament history, while Guinard would be the first Frenchman to win the doubles title at this event.
- > Team is ranked No. 6 on [PIF ATP Doubles Teams Rankings](#). Andreozzi is ranked No. 16 (career-high) and Guinard is ranked No. 17 (career-high No. 14 in March 2026).
- > Andreozzi, 34, is 4-2 in ATP Tour finals, earning three titles on clay at 2024 Umag w/Reyes-Varela, 2025 Buenos Aires w/Arribage and 2025 Bastad w/Arends before ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title with Guinard.
- > He would be fourth Argentine to win ATP Tour doubles title on grass courts after Javier Frana at 1993 Newport w/van Rensburg, Maximo Gonzalez at 2021 Mallorca w/Bolelli and Horacio Zeballos at 2022 Halle w/Granollers.
- > Guinard, 30, is 3-4 in ATP Tour finals, also capturing 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo and 2025 Umag w/Arneodo.
