### HSBC CHAMPIONSHIPS TALKING POINTS

- World No. 6 **Alex de Minaur** leads all players in ATP 500 wins since the start of 2023 season (57) and opens his title campaign on Tuesday vs. **Gabriel Diallo**. Australian leads their **Lexus ATP Head2Head** 2-0 and enters this event after his run to ‘s-Hertogenbosch final last week. Diallo aims to record his first Top 10 win in 12th attempt to join countryman, **Denis Shapovalov**, who defeated Pinnington Jones on Day 1, in 2R.
- No. 2 seed **Jiri Lehecka** will attempt to break **Kamil Majchrzak**’s hot streak on Tuesday, as 24-year-old Czech, who advanced to last year’s **HSBC Championships** final, aims to reach 2R at this event for the third time in as many appearances. Majchrzak defeated No. 4 Auger-Aliassime in QF, No. 8 Medvedev in SF and No. 6 de Minaur in final to win ‘s-Hertogenbosch title last week and now seeks fourth consecutive Top 20 win.
- British No. 1 **Cameron Norrie** takes on No. 4 seed **Alejandro Davidovich Fokina** in a first-round encounter between two Top 30 players. Norrie is the most recent home player to advance to Queen’s Club men’s final, doing so in 2021, before losing to Berrettini. In other British action, wildcards **Arthur Fery** and **Toby Samuel** face each other on **Court 1** with both players making their main draw debut at this event.
- Two-time champion **Marin Cilic** will tie Hewitt and Murray for most main draw appearances at this event in the Open Era (16), when he steps on the court to play **Ugo Humbert** in his first round on Tuesday. 37-year-old Croatian, who won titles in 2012 and 2018 (d. Djokovic), also attempts to tie Boris Becker for fourth-most wins at this event in the Open Era (36), while Humbert aims to record his first win in third appearance.

**Jakub Mensik** | Age: 20 | World No. 16 | Career-High No. 12 | 2026: 23-10 (Auckland Title) | Queen's: 1-1 (2025 2R)  
 > Former World No. 2 junior broke into Top 100 in February 2025 and earned career-high No. 12 in March 2026 after defeating No. 2 Sinner for biggest win of career to reach Doha SF.  
 > Defeated 6-time champion Djokovic in 2025 Miami final to become the fourth man in series history to win 1st ATP Tour title at a Masters 1000 event and 1st Czech ATP Masters 1000 champion since Berdych at 2005 Paris.  
 > Also in Miami, joined Alcaraz as only teenagers to earn multiple Top 5 wins in one event in this century.  
 > Advanced to 2026 Roland Garros SF, becoming youngest Czech men's Grand Slam semi-finalist in history.  
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2024 Doha by defeating former champions Murray, No. 5 Rublev and Monfils, becoming 1st man born in 2005 or later to play in an ATP Tour final.  
 > In tour-level debut, reached 3R at 2023 US Open as Q, becoming youngest man to reach Grand Slam 3R since Nadal at 2004 Aus. Open and youngest at US Open since Santoro in 1990, losing to Fritz on 18th birthday.  
 > Posted 85-28 record on ITF Juniors circuit, highlighted by reaching 2022 Australian Open boys' singles final.

**NOTE:** Mensik is making his second appearance at the event after reaching 2R last year and plays in his first match since advancing to Roland Garros SF. This season, the 20-year-old is 20-0 after winning 1st set and 9-1 in opening rounds (l. to Popyrin in Rome 2R). Czech No. 2 is also 7-0 vs. left-handers since the start of 2025 season.

**Adrian Mannarino** | Age: 37 | World No. 44 | Career-High No. 17 | 2026: 9-16 (Montpellier F) | Event: 11-10 ('11, '18, '23 QF)  
 > Ended 13 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-25) and became the oldest man to break into Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 35, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.  
 > Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.  
 > Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.  
 > Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.  
 > Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024 and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018 and posted win over No. 6 Shelton via RET to reach 2025 US Open 4R, after 0-22 start vs. Top-10 at Grand Slams.

**NOTE:** Mannarino is playing in his 11th Queen's Club main draw, debuting in 2011, and aims to record 10 tour-level wins in 15 of last 16 years (went 1-7 in 2012). He bids to be the second-oldest match winner in Queen's in this century after Lopez, 39, in 2021 (d. Marchenko) and seeks first Top 20 win since defeating No. 16 Bublik in Beijing last year.

**G. Mpetshi Perricard** | Age: 22 | World No. 87 | Career-High No. 29 | 2026: 8-13 (3 QFs) | Queen's: 1-2 (2024 2R)  
 > Began 2024 season as No. 205 and broke into Top 100 in May, Top 50 in July and achieved career-high No. 29 in February 2025.  
 > Recorded 6-1 start to career vs. Top 20 opponents, including wins over former champion No. 19 Auger-Aliassime and No. 14 Rune to win 2024 Basel title without dropping serve all tournament (60 of 60 service games won).  
 > Saved a championship point to win 1st ATP Tour title in his hometown of Lyon in 2024 as No. 117-ranked WC.  
 > Entered 2024 Wimbledon as LL, defeating No. 21 Korda in 1R for 1st Grand Slam main draw win en route to becoming 1st lucky loser to reach Wimbledon 4R since Norman in 1995.  
 > Owns 56-34 Challenger record (5-0 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Leon, 2024 Nottingham, 2024 Cuernavaca, 2024 Acapulco and 2025 Bordeaux.  
 > Peaked at No. 4 in junior rankings during 2021 season, after advancing to 2021 Roland Garros boys' singles SF (l. to Fils) and winning the boys' doubles title w/Fils.

**NOTE:** Mpetshi Perricard seeks third Top 50 win of the season after defeating No. 20 Paul in Brisbane 1R and No. 28 Norrie in Auckland 2R in first two weeks of the season (0-8 since). He is on a 14-match winning streak vs. left-handers across all levels (6-0 on tour-level) since losing to Shimizu in Chicago Challenger SF in July 2023.

**Corentin Moutet** | Age: 27 | World No. 36 | Career-High No. 30 | 2026: 6-13 (Marrakech QF) | Queen's: 1-1 ('25 2R)  
 > Former Top-10 junior ended 2022 at No. 51, breaking inside Top 50 in July 2025 and achieving career-high No. 30 in April 2026 after earning personal-best 31 wins in 2025, highlighted by finals in Mallorca and Almaty.  
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour final as 20-year-old at 2020 Doha, becoming youngest French finalist on tour since Gasquet, 20, at 2006 Lyon.  
 > Beat former champion Wawrinka en route to 2022 US Open 4R, becoming 1st men's lucky loser on record to reach US Open 4R and advanced to 4R of 2024 Roland Garros and 3R of 2024 Paris Olympics.  
 > Defeated future World No. 3 Tsitsipas for 1st Challenger title at 2017 Brest as 18-year-old WC.  
 > In 2025, recorded first Top 10 wins of career over No. 10 Rune in ATP Masters 1000 Rome 3R in 3H 45M and saved 1 MP for biggest win of career over No. 4 Fritz in Queen's Club 1R in 2H 54M.  
 > Enjoys rapping and playing piano, having released an 8-song EP entitled "Ecorche" in 2020.

**NOTE:** Moutet attempts to break a 6-match losing streak since defeating Buse in Barcelona 1R in April. 27-year-old aims to advance to 2R at this event in back-to-back years after saving 1 MP to defeat No. 4 Fritz in 1R last year.

**Alex de Minaur** | Age: 27 | World No. 6 (Career-High) | 2026: 22-12 (Rotterdam Title) | Queen's: 8-6 (2023 Final)  
 > Two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 6 in July 2024 before becoming 1st Australian to qualify for Nitto ATP Finals in singles since Hewitt in 2004.  
 > Earned personal-best 56 victories in 2025 and captured 11 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500 championships at 2023 and 2024 Acapulco, 2025 Washington and 2026 Rotterdam.  
 > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open immediately after winning 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati w/Carreno Busta in team debut and at same venue.  
 > Seven-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist, including at four consecutive events at 2024 Roland Garros, Wimbledon, US Open and 2025 Australian Open and advanced to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF, SF and final at 2023 Toronto.  
 > Playing for Australia, he went 6-1 in Davis Cup play during 2022 season, leading Australia to its 1st final since 2003 and defeated No. 2 Nadal in 2023 and No. 1 Djokovic in 2024 at United Cup.

**NOTE:** de Minaur is the No. 1 seed at an ATP Tour event for the fourth time in his career (2024 's-Hertogenbosch, 2024 Antwerp, 2026 Rotterdam) and owns 10-1 record as the top seed on tour-level. He seeks first win in Queen's since reaching 2023 final, losing to eventual finalists Musetti in 2024 1R and Lehecka in last year's 1R.

**Gabriel Diallo** | Age: 24 | World No. 84 | Career-High No. 33 | 2026: 6-14 (Indian Wells 3R) | Queen's: 1-1 (2025 2R)  
 > Broke into Top 100 in October 2024 and Top 50 in June 2025, achieving career-high No. 33 in August 2025 after capturing 1st ATP Tour title in 's-Hertogenbosch, becoming first Canadian man to win a grass court title since 1993.  
 > Saved 3 MPs to defeat No. 16 Dimitrov for biggest win of career and advance to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2025 Madrid as LL and 2 MPs vs. Thompson en route to 2025 's-Hertogenbosch title.  
 > Earned 1st ATP Tour win by defeating No. 21 Evans at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Toronto 1R as WC and reached 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2024 Almaty.  
 > Owns 65-37 Challenger record (3-1 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Granby as No. 519-ranked WC.  
 > Played for the University of Kentucky, making the quarter-final round at 2022 NCAA Singles Championships before turning pro at the end of 2022.

**NOTE:** Diallo is 0-11 vs. Top 10 and aims to record the biggest win of his career to become the first man to oust No. 1 seed in 1R at this event since Peniston defeated No. 1 seed Ruud in 2022 1R. He aims to break a 4-match losing streak, including loss to Mannarino in 's-Hertogenbosch 1R last week, where he was defending the title.

**Cameron Norrie** | Age: 30 | World No. 29 | Career-High No. 8 | 2026: 14-13 (2 QFs) | Queen's: 6-8 (2021 Final)  
 > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.  
 > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.  
 > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets and advanced to 2nd Grand Slam QF at 2025 Wimbledon.  
 > Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before defeating No. 1 Alcaraz at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Paris for biggest win of career.  
 > Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

**NOTE:** Norrie aims to advance to Queen's Club 2R for the third time in ninth appearance (2021 Final, 2023 QF). He is playing in his first match since retiring in Roland Garros 1R vs. Vallejo due to rib injury and looks to record second Top 30 win of the season (1-4) after defeating No. 6 de Minaur at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells in March.

**A. Davidovich Fokina** | Age: 27 | World No. 22 | Career-High No. 14 | 2026: 13-12 (Adelaide SF) | Queen's: 2-3 ('22 QF)  
 > Made Top 20 debut in July 2025 and achieved career-high No. 14 in November 2025 following his run to 5th ATP Tour final in Basel after previously peaking at No. 21 in 2023.  
 > Broke Djokovic 9 times in Monte-Carlo 2R win, setting record for most breaks of Djokovic in a best-of-3-set match to defeat then-World No. 1 en route to 1st ATP Tour final of career at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo.  
 > Advanced to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 Roland Garros and 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2021 Monte-Carlo, highlighted by 5-set win over Ruud in Roland Garros 3R.  
 > In 2025, advanced to 4 ATP Tour finals, including Delray Beach, where he held 2 championship points vs. Kecmanovic, and Washington, where he squandered 3 championship points vs. de Minaur.  
 > Ended junior career as World No. 2 after winning Wimbledon boys' singles title and posting 20-1 record in 2017.

**NOTE:** Davidovich Fokina looks for second Top 30 win of the season (1-5) after defeating No. 12 Mensik at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells in March. 27-year-old, who went 10-0 vs. left-handers last year, is 1-5 vs. lefties this season, including loss to No. 78 Bellucci in Stuttgart 1R last week to begin his grass-court season.

**Kamil Majchrzak** | Age: 30 | World No. 47 (Career-High) | 2026: 12-9 ('s-Hertogenbosch Title) | Queen's: 0-0 ('22 Q1)  
 > Former World No. 7 junior broke into Top 100 in 2019 and achieved career-high No. 47 in June 2026 after defeating No. 4 Auger-Aliassime, No. 8 Medvedev and No. 6 de Minaur to win 1st ATP Tour title in 's-Hertogenbosch.  
 > Advanced to ATP Tour SFs at 2022 Pune and 2025 Marrakech as Q, before defeating former finalist Berrettini en route to 2025 Wimbledon 4R and saving 5 MPs to defeat No. 9 Khachanov in 2025 US Open 2R.  
 > In 2019, qualified at Australian Open and Wimbledon before advancing to US Open 3R as LL with 5-set wins over Jarry and Cuevas.  
 > Owns 183-108 Challenger record (9-6 in finals), defeating future Top-20 players Carreno Busta and Cecchinato to reach 1st final at 2015 Mohammedia as Q.  
 > Ended junior career as 2014 Youth Olympics gold medallist, also capturing 2013 US Open boys' doubles title w/Ma. Redlicki and earning wins over future Top-10 ATP players Berrettini, Fritz, Hurkacz, Medvedev and Rublev.

**NOTE:** Majchrzak is on a 5-match winning streak after winning 1st ATP Tour title in 's-Hertogenbosch last week, breaking inside Top 50 for the first time on Monday. He aims to be the first Polish men's match winner at this event since Fibak in 1985 and record his fourth consecutive Top 20 win after entering last week with 1-13 record vs. Top 20.

**Jiri Lehecka** | Age: 24 | World No. 12 (Career-High) | 2026: 19-11 (Miami Final) | Queen's: 5-2 (2025 Final)  
 > Broke into Top 20 in September 2025 and achieved career-high No. 12 in May 2026 soon after reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 final without dropping serve en route (56 of 56 service games won) in Miami.  
 > Joined Berdych, P. Korda and Lendl as only Czech men to advance to quarter-finals of both hard-court Grand Slams after reaching last 8 stage at Australian Open in 2023 and US Open in 2025.  
 > Also in Australia, captured both career ATP Tour titles at 2024 Adelaide and 2025 Brisbane.  
 > Defeated No. 5 Rublev to reach 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Doha and en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2024 Indian Wells before defeating No. 4 Medvedev via RET to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF at 2024 Madrid.  
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Rotterdam as Q after defeating No. 12 Shapovalov in 1R for 1st ATP Tour win.  
 > Celebrated 21st birthday during 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals and finished as runner-up.  
 > Former World No. 10 junior won 2019 Wimbledon boys' doubles title with countryman Forejtek.

**NOTE:** Lehecka aims to become the second Czech man to record 20 wins this season, joining Mensik (23). He is a Top-2 seed at an ATP Tour event for the second time in his career (No. 1 seed at 2023 Umag). Last year at Queen's Club, became first Czech finalist at this event since Lendl in 1990, losing to Alcaraz in 3 sets.
