Jovic leads 1-0

Jovic:

- Making her tournament debut this week
- Defeated Ruzic in 1r this week for her 24th Tour-level win of the year (tied for 8th-most match-wins on Tour in 2026)
- Her win over Ruzic was her first career Tour-level win on grass; her only prior Tour-level main draw match on grass was a 1r loss to Lamens at Wimbledon last year (following 3 qualifying wins to make the 2025 Wimbledon main draw)
- Her career-best performance at a WTA 500 event is winning the title at 2025 Guadalajara (d. Arango in F)
- Best tournament finish so far this year is R-Up at Hobart (l. Cocciaretto in F); she also made her first career Grand Slam QF at 2026 Australian Open (l. eventual R-Up Sabalenka)
- Jovic defeated today's opponent Eala two weeks ago in the Roland Garros 1r

Eala:

- Making her tournament debut this week
- Defeated Zhang Shuai in this week's 1r for her first Tour-level win since 2026 Rome 2r (d. Wang Xinyu)
- Owns 6 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.4 Coco Gauff at 2026 Indian Wells (via retirement)
- Went 10-5 on grass last year (spanning all tournament levels and qualifying), including her first career WTA Tour singles final at Eastbourne (l. Joint in F in 3rd-set TB)
- Started her 2026 grass-court swing by winning last week's WTA 125 title in Birmingham (d. Bartunkova in F)
- Best tournament finish at Tour-level so far this year is SF at Auckland (l. eventual R-Up Wang Xinyu)

Laura Siegemund (GER #44) vs. [2] Amanda Anisimova (USA #5)

First meeting

Siegemund:

- Making her tournament debut this week
- Defeated Francesca Jones in 1r this week for her first match-win since 2026 Rome 2r (d. Alexandrova)
- Owns 13 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.5 Mirra Andrejeva at 2025 Wuhan (0-3 vs. Top 10 players in 2026)
- Went 4-3 on grass last year at Tour-level; following 1r losses at Nottingham (as qualifier) and Bad Homburg, she made her first career Wimbledon QF ranked No.104 (l. Sabalenka in QF)
- Seeking her first QF since Wuhan in October 2025 (l. eventual champion Gauff in QF)
- Career-best result at a WTA 500 event was winning the title at 2017 Stuttgart (d. Mladenovic in F in 3rd-set tiebreak)

Anisimova:

- Making 2nd appearance at this event, finishing as runner-up here last year (l. Maria in F)
- Her performance here last year is also her career-best result at a WTA 500 event
- Anisimova was the player with the most grass-court wins at Tour-level in 2025 (12), ahead of 2nd-placed Swiatek (10)
- Went 12-3 on grass last year - after her run to the final here (d. Top 10 players Zheng and Navarro en route), Anisimova went on to reach Berlin QF (l. Samsonova) and her first Grand Slam final at Wimbledon (l. Swiatek in F)
- Seeking her first QF since SF run at Dubai in February (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Her best tournament finish so far this year is her SF run at WTA 1000 Dubai

[3] Victoria Mboko (CAN #9) vs. Karolina Pliskova (CZE #106)**First meeting*****Mboko:***

- Making debut appearance at this event - her second career grass event on the Tour after Wimbledon 2025
- Best result at WTA 500 events is R-Up at Adelaide 2026 (l. M. Andrejeva in F) and Strasbourg 2026 (l. Navarro in F)
- Record against opponents outside Top 100 stands at 4-0 in 2026
- Best career result on grass is 2r at Wimbledon 2025 (as lucky loser, l. Baptiste), which was her grass debut at Tour-level events. Defeating No.24 Frech in 1r at Wimbledon 2025 is her sole career main draw win on grass thus far
- Is currently ranked a career-high No.9; made her Top 10 debut earlier this year on February 16, becoming the fourth Canadian woman to reach Top 10 after Carling Bassett-Seguso, Eugenie Bouchard and Bianca Andreescu
- Playing doubles with Serena Williams this week, and they won their opening match against No.3 seeds Melichar-Martinez/Routliffe

Pliskova:

- Making debut appearance at this event
- She is a 9-time champion at WTA 500 events, including twice on grass at Eastbourne in both 2017 and 2019
- Owns 39 wins in career over Top 10 players at Tour events, most recently No.4 Amanda Anisimova at Doha 2026 (via ret.)
- Three out of her 17 singles titles have come on grass at Eastbourne 2019 (d. Kerber in F), Eastbourne 2017 (d. Wozniacki in F) and Nottingham 2016 (d. Riske-Amritraj in F)
- Also reached a Grand Slam final on grass, finishing runner-up at 2021 Wimbledon (l. Barty in F in three sets)
- The former World No.1 is currently ranked No.106 (from outside Top 1000 at the beginning of the 2026 season, due to not playing most of 2025 season); this time last year was ranked No.186

Marie Bouzkova (CZE #28) vs. [LL] Donna Vekic (CRO #76)**Bouzkova leads 1-0*****Bouzkova:***

- Making debut appearance at this event
- Career best result at WTA 500 events is reaching final at Washington DC 2024 (l. Badosa in F)
- Best career results on grass are QF runs at Wimbledon 2022 (l. eventual R-Up Jabeur) and Birmingham 2021 (l. Vandeweghe) – her 2022 Wimbledon QF is also her career-best Grand Slam result
- Has won 15 Tour-level matches so far this year; her best result of 2026 is title run at Bogota (d. Udvardy in F)
- Is currently ranked No.28 (career-best No.24 in 2022); this time last year was ranked No.44

Vekic:

- Making 2nd appearance at this event; she fell 1r in 2025 (l. Zakharova)
- Has posted four runner-up finishes at WTA 500 events, among which two are on grass at Berlin 2023 (l. Kvitova) and Bad Homburg 2024 (l. Shnaider)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Had breakthrough week at WTA 500 Guadalajara in 2025, making her first Tour-level QF (saved MP vs. Jimenez Kasintseva) and going on to win her first Tour title at age 17 (d. Arango in final); rose from No.73 to No.36 following her triumph in Mexico
- Also in 2025, won WTA 125 title at Ilkley (d. Marino in final) and played all four Grand Slam main draws; made Top 100 and Top 50 debuts and peaked at No.33 on October 20
- In 2024, made US Open 2r in her first Grand Slam and Tour-level appearance (as wild card); reached final at ITF W100 Tyler and ended the year with a career-high ranking of No.194
- Claimed her first ITF title in 2023 at 25K Reading
- Played her first ITF tournament in 2022 reaching the final at 15K Los Angeles; also reached 3r at 2022 Junior US Open
- Breakout 2025 season saw her break into the Top 100 after SF run at WTA 1000 Miami; as a wild card she registered back-to-back Top 10 wins over No.5 Keys and No.2 Swiatek.
