### [7] Sorana Cirstea (ROU #18) vs. Emma Raducanu (GBR #42)

Tied 1-1

#### *Cirstea:*

- Making debut appearance at this event
- Her best results at WTA 500 events are SF runs at Stanford 2013 (l. Cibulkova) and 2012 (l. S. Williams), and Los Angeles 2009 (l. Stosur)
- Owns 12 wins over Top 50 players this year, most recently defeating No.1 Sabalenka, No.13 Noskova and No. 36 Ostapenko at Rome 2026
- Best career result on grass is SF run at Birmingham 2022 (l. Zhang Shuai)
- Is currently ranked a career-high No.18, which she reached for the first time last month
- Has won 30 matches so far in 2026; she is ranked No.5 on tour for match-wins this year, behind Mirra Andreeva (36), Elina Svitolina (32), Aryna Sabalenka (31) and Elena Rybakina (31)
- Won her 4th career WTA singles title earlier this year at Cluj-Napoca (d. today's opponent Raducanu in F)

#### *Raducanu:*

- Making 2nd appearance at this event; she reached QF last year (l. Zheng Qinwen), which is also United Kingdom's best result at this tournament
- Career-best result at WTA 500 events is SF run at Washington 2025 (l. eventual R-Up Kalinskaya)
- Defeated Anna Blinkova in this week's 1r – her first match-win since Indian Wells in March when she defeated Zakharova to reach R32 (l. Anisimova)
- Looking to obtain her first Top 20 win since defeating No.17 Daria Kasatkina at Strasbourg 2025, just over a year ago
- Best career Tour-level result on grass is SF run at Nottingham in 2024 (l. eventual champion Boulter)
- Finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca this year, losing in the final to today's opponent Cirstea – this was the second Tour-level final of Raducanu's career after winning US Open in 2021 (d. Fernandez in F)

### Marie Bouzkova (CZE #28) vs. [LL] Donna Vekic (CRO #76)

Bouzkova leads 1-0

#### *Bouzkova:*

- Making debut appearance at this event
- Career best result at WTA 500 events is reaching final at Washington DC 2024 (l. Badosa in F)
- Best career results on grass are QF runs at Wimbledon 2022 (l. eventual R-Up Jabeur) and Birmingham 2021 (l. Vandeweghe) – her 2022 Wimbledon QF is also her career-best Grand Slam result
- Has won 15 Tour-level matches so far this year; her best result of 2026 is title run at Bogota (d. Udvardy in F)
- Is currently ranked No.28 (career-best No.24 in 2022); this time last year was ranked No.44

#### *Vekic:*

- Making 2nd appearance at this event; she fell 1r in 2025 (l. Zakharova)
- Has posted four runner-up finishes at WTA 500 events, among which two are on grass at Berlin 2023 (l. Kvitova) and Bad Homburg 2024 (l. Shnaider)
- Entered main draw as lucky loser (after withdrawal of No.5 seed Kostyuk due to right ankle injury) and defeated Stojisavljevic in 1r
- Owns one WTA Tour singles title on grass at Nottingham 2017 (d. Konta)
- Her career-best Grand Slam result occurred on grass, making 2024 Wimbledon SF (l. eventual R-Up Paolini)

**[1] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2) vs. [Q] Tatjana Maria (GER #52)****Tied 1-1*****Rybakina:***

- Making 2nd appearance at this event, where her previous result was reaching QF in 2025 (l. today's opponent and eventual champion Maria)
- Owns one singles title on grass – her first Grand Slam title at Wimbledon 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)
- Picked up her second career Grand Slam title earlier this year at Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F), then won her second title of the year at Stuttgart (d. Muchova in F)
- Has won 31 matches so far in 2026; she is ranked No.3 on tour for match-wins this year, level with Aryna Sabalenka (31), and behind only Mirra Andrejeva (36) and Elina Svitolina (32)
- Holds an 11-3 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50

***Maria:***

- Returns as the defending champion, having defeated Anisimova in the final here last year (also d. today's opponent Rybakina in last year's QF here)
- Last year at Queen's Club, then-37-year-old Maria became the oldest WTA Tour singles titlist since 38-year-old Serena Williams triumphed at 2020 Auckland
- Defeated Maria Sakkari in this week's 1r, her first Top 50 win of the year (previously 0-7 vs. Top 50 players in 2026)
- Holds 6-0 career record in main draw matches at Queen's Club (and is also 4-0 in qualifying matches at this event)
- Started her 2026 grass swing last week by reaching 2r at WTA 125 Birmingham (l. Masarova)
- Owns 6 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.8 Madison Keys here last year, en route to the title (Rybakina was ranked No.11 in their match here last year)
- Has won two WTA Tour grass-court titles: 2018 Mallorca and this event last year

**Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #38) vs. [WC] Katie Boulter (GBR #73)****Boulter leads 2-1*****Cristian:***

- Making her tournament debut this week
- Defeated Zheng Qinwen in this week's 1r – that was just Cristian's 2nd career match-win on grass (previously d. Bronzetti at 2023 Wimbledon)
- Lost both of her Tour-level meetings vs. today's opponent Boulter (at 2022 Tallinn and 2026 Rouen), but defeated Boulter at ITF/60K-Burnie in 2018 (in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- Her career-best performance at a WTA 500 event occurred at the most recent WTA 500 event – a SF run at 2026 Strasbourg (l. eventual R-Up Mboko), which is also her best tournament result this season
- Reached career-high ranking of No.28 last month (currently ranked No.38)

***Boulter:***

- Making 2nd appearance at this event; she also reached 2r last year (l. Shnaider)
- Defeated No.8 seed Leylah Fernandez in this week's 1r – that was her 2nd Top 25 win of the year (also d. No.16 Tauson at 2026 Miami, via retirement)
- Her career-best performance at a WTA 500 event is winning the title at 2024 San Diego (d. Kostyuk in F)
- 2 of her 4 career WTA singles titles have come on grass, back-to-back at Nottingham in 2023 (d. Burrage in F) and 2024 (d. Ka.Pliskova in F)
- One of 3 players from United Kingdom to reach this week's 2r (also Raducanu and Dart)
- Her top performance this year is winning her 4th career WTA singles title at Ostrava (d. Korpatsch in F)

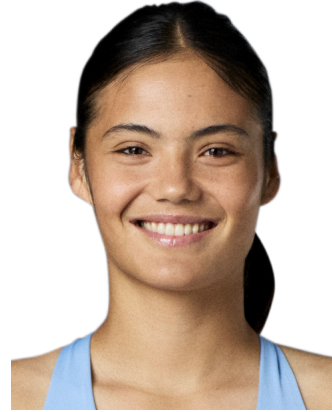

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won Cleveland title as qualifier (first WTA Tour singles final since 2021; d. Li in final) en route to tenth straight Top 100 year-end finish in singles; also won her biggest career doubles title at WTA 1000 Madrid (w/Kalinskaya)
- Highlights of 2024 came in the Middle East, making QF at Abu Dhabi and saving six match points in her Dubai QF match against Vondrousova to reach SF (l. eventual champion Paolini). Ended her 2024 season after Wimbledon to undergo foot surgery
- 2023 saw her best results achieved in the USA: advanced to Indian Wells QF for first time (l. Swiatek), then made SF at Miami (l. eventual champion Kvitova) and QF at US Open (l. Muchova)
- In 2022, reached SF on all three surfaces: hard court at Lyon (l. Yastremska), clay at Istanbul (l. Kudermetova), and grass at Birmingham (l. Zhang). Also enjoyed success at the Australian Open, where she fell in R16 (l. Swiatek)
- Highlight of 2021 was ending near-13-year wait for 2nd WTA Tour singles title, triumphing at Istanbul (d. Mertens in F). Also finished R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Krejckikova), reached QF at Grampians Trophy and Portoroz, and R16 at Roland Garros
- Ended 2020 by winning singles title at ITF/\$100K Dubai-UAE in December (d. Siniakova in F). Also in 2020, reached 3r at US Open and advanced to 2r at Australian Open
- In 2019, advanced to fourth career Tour singles final at Tashkent (l. Van Uytvanck); also captured fifth career Tour doubles title at 2019 Lugano (w/Mitu, d. Kudermetova/Voskoboeva in F)
- Reached R16 at 2017 Australian Open - first time advancing to that stage at a Slam since she made 2009 Roland Garros QF (l. Stosur)
- In 2016, played a mix of WTA and ITF events, improving ranking by 163 ranking places to No.81 on comeback from shoulder injury, with highlights being a SF run at Rio de Janeiro (l. Rogers) and making QF at Madrid (as wildcard, l. eventual R-Up Cibulkova) and Mallorca (as qualifier, l. Jankovic)
- Reached biggest singles final of career at 2013 Toronto - posted three Top 10 wins en route to final (No.10 Wozniacki, No.7 Kvitova and No.5 Li) before falling to No.1 S. Williams. Following Toronto run, posted career-high ranking of No.21 on August 21, 2013
- Won first WTA singles title at 2008 Tashkent (d. Lisicki in F)
- Best result in 2025 was reaching SF Washington DC (l. Kalinskaya). Reached QF at a WTA 1000 event for the first time at Miami; also made QF on home soil at London, Queen's Club. Ended the season ranked inside the Top 30 (No.29) for a second year after 2021. In doubles, reached first Tour-level SF at Washington DC with Elena Rybakina
- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made 4r of Indian Wells (l. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best win-by-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the 2021 US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell in 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top 50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR

- Fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2008 Australian Open (l. No.4 seed Ivanovic)
- Made first WTA singles final at 2007 Budapest (l. Dulko)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2006 Stockholm (l. Kanepi in 1r)
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in 2004

- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarterfinals at Wimbledon and US Open in 2018

- Also in 2023, reached 2r as qualifier at both Montreal and Beijing; on ITF Circuit won one singles title at Canberra and reached two finals in Japan; went 2-0 in singles in November's Billie Jean King Cup play-offs against Sweden
- During the 2022 grass court season, advanced to QF at Nottingham (ret. vs. Davis w/right elbow injury) and 2r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Opened 2021 season by reaching 3r at the Gippsland Trophy in Melbourne (l. Osaka); upset No.14 seed Gauff in 2r
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$15k ITF/Sharm El-Sheikh-EGY. Earlier in the year, made 2r at Acapulco (l. Zhu) and fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Svitolina) in only Tour-level outings
- Suffered a stress fracture in her back which forced her out for much of 2019. Best results prior to injury were 2r showing at Australian Open and SF run at \$25K ITF/Solapur-IND (l. Raina)
- Won the WTA's first-ever 10-point match tie-break at a Slam to see off Makarova in 1r at 2019 Australian Open
- Reached career-high No.82 on February 18, 2019
- Broke into the Top 100 the week of October 15, 2018
- Made significant strides in 2018, reaching first WTA QF of career at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Barty) - defeated Stosur en route for her first win over a Grand Slam winner. Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)

- Fell in 1r on Tour-level main draw singles debut at 2017 Wimbledon (as WC, l. McHale)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of seven singles titles and four doubles titles
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Great Britain in 2011
- Appeared in girls' singles at all four Slams, reaching 3r at Australian Open, Wimbledon and US Open, and was R-Up in doubles at 2014 Australian Open (w/Jorovic, l. Kalinina/Kulichkova). Other junior highlights include winning Lemon Bowl in Rome at age of 11, and reaching final at Junior Orange Bowl in Florida at age 14

- Williams is a former WTA World No.1 in doubles and spent a total of 8 weeks at the top spot
- Williams took the joint-No.1 position with sister Venus this week 16 years ago, from June 7, 2010 to August 1, 2010
- Williams has never faced Fernandez or Siegemund before in her doubles career – Williams has played Siegemund three times in singles, and won each of those matches in straight sets

#### MBOKO/WILLIAMS QUICK HITS:

- Mboko is competing in her sixth doubles tournament of the season; she equalled her best career result in doubles by reaching quarterfinal at 2026 Indian Wells w/M.Andreeva, and has reached another quarterfinal this week
- Mboko also reached the quarterfinals last year at WTA 500 Tokyo w/Andreescu
- Williams returns to tennis nearly four years after stepping away at the 2022 US Open

- Williams owns a total of 23 doubles titles beginning at Oklahoma City in 1998 and most recently at Wimbledon in 2016
- Williams won 22 of her doubles titles with sister Venus; the only title she won with a different partner was in 2002 at Leipzig with Alexandra Stevenson
- Among Williams' 23 titles, 14 are Grand Slam titles and three are Olympic titles
- Williams is the only player female or male to achieve a 'Career Golden Slam' by winning the singles and doubles at all four majors at some point, as well as gold medals in both singles (2012 London) and doubles (2000 Sydney, 2008 Beijing and 2012 London, all with Venus)
- Williams only ever lost two doubles finals; Auckland in 2020, partnering Caroline Wozniacki and San Diego in 1999 with Venus Williams
- Williams' first success at the majors actually came in mixed doubles, with titles at Wimbledon and the US Open in 1998, both with Max Mirnyi
- Among many records set, Williams remains the all-time prize money leader in women's sports, earning more than \$94.8 million during her career across singles and doubles. She topped the annual WTA prize money charts on six occasions (2002, 2008-09, 2013-15). Her 2013 earnings of \$12,385,572 remained the WTA record for a single season until Aryna Sabalenka surpassed \$15 million in 2025

- Fernandez and Siegemund are pairing up for the first time as a team at Queen's Club this week
- Siegemund reached No.4 in the WTA doubles rankings in 2024, and she has won 16 Tour-level doubles titles in her career including a women's doubles Grand Slam title at 2020 US Open (w/Zvonareva)
- In 2023, Siegemund/Zvonareva won the title at the WTA Finals (d. Melichar-Martinez/Perez in F) and they were also runners-up at 2023 US Open (l. Dabrowski/Routliffe in F)
- Siegemund is also a two-time mixed doubles Grand Slam champion at 2016 US Open (w/Pavic) and 2024 Roland Garros (w/Roger-Vasselin)
- Siegemund owns 2 grass-court doubles titles, 10 years apart at 2015 's-Hertogenbosch (w/Muhammad) and 2025 Nottingham (w/Haddad Maia) – those two titles are her first and most recent WTA Tour titles respectively
- Siegemund has made one doubles final this year at WTA 1000 Dubai (w/Zvonareva, l. Dabrowski/Stefani in F)
- Fernandez has reached four Tour-level doubles finals in her career, including a Grand Slam final at 2023 Roland Garros (w/Townsend; l. Hsieh/Wang Xinyu in F) – she has yet to reach a doubles final on grass
- Fernandez is seeking her first Tour-level doubles title, and her first doubles final since 2024 Cincinnati (w/Putintseva)
